Addressing the seminar Mahbub said, 'The life of a migrant worker no matter which country they are in is never easy and the switch from being a migrant worker to an improbable profession like acting was full of challenges.'

In his keynote speech, Mahbub also said that the struggles and challenges that Bangladeshi migrant worker face abroad, was the main inspiration behind his decision to switch profession. That was why over the years he had put in a lot of effort to create platforms for cultural exchanges between Bangladesh and South Korea.

One of those efforts include establishing the Migrant Workers TV that specialises in the migrant population in South Korea where he produced acclaimed programmes such as The World of a Migrant Worker and the Multilingual News.
