Trustee

Barrister Mainul Hosein



arrister Mainul Hosein is a founder Trustee of Education, Science, Technology and Cultural Development Trust (ESTCDT), the founding Trust of IUB. Born in Perojpur district of Barisal in January 1940, Barrister Mainul Hosein, the eldest son of brave and renowned journalist of the country Tafazzal Hossain (Manik Mia), did his schooling in Calcutta, Perojpur and Dhaka. He completed his school final

exam (Matriculation) from Nawabpur Govt High School, Dhaka. He was associated with the scout movement as the leader of his school's troop. He did his Intermediate with Science from Dhaka College.

In 1961 he did his honours in Political Science from Dhaka University and went to London for studying Law, got admitted to Middle Temple Inn. in December the same year. He returned as Barrister-at-Law in 1965 and joined Dhaka Bar Council as a Barrister and started law as his career in the same year.

In 1969, at the sudden demise of his father, he had to take the responsibility as the Editor of Ittefaq for overcoming the immediate crisis of the void created in the absence of his father.

In 1973, he returned to his own profession law leaving the responsibility of Ittefaq as an editor, but he continued as the Chairman of the board of editors.

In 1973, he was elected Member of the Parliament from his village constituency of Bhandaria-Kathalia (Barisal).

When the government changed the basic character of Constitution for introducing one-party system (BAKSAL) in 1975, it was huge a crisis for him not to go along with Bangabandhu. At the same time he could not give up his belief in democracy. So he chose to resign from the membership of the Parliament along with Bangabir General MAG Osmani. Barrister Mainul Hosein was President of the Supreme Court Bar Association, Bangladesh from 2000 to 2001.

He was elected several times the President of Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Parishad and member of Press Council. Mr. Hosein was also second most important member of Press Commission established for the first time in Bangladesh. Mr.

Commission established for the first time in Bangladesh. Mr. Ataur Rahman Khan, former Prime Minister of Bangladesh, Mr. Gazi Shamsur Rahman, Chairman, the Press Council together with Mr. Hosein played the major role in finalising the legal framework for the press freedom namely the Press Commission's Report.

In 2007, there arose a serious political deadlock over holding of the general elections. The civilian government collapsed and there prevailed a civil war situation. Martial law became inevitable. To avoid martial law and allow the constitutional process to be saved, Barrister Hosein agreed after much hesitation, to join the army backed caretaker government in 2007. He thought the army should be helped not to impose martial law. When he could not be sure of the political road map for the transfer of power, and wanted to be sure, he had to resign in the middle of two years term.

Even under the constrictions of emergency situation he, as Law Adviser during his one-year period, passed the law separating the judiciary from the Executive which the politician failed to do ever since the constitutional commitment of 1972. The codification of all the laws of Bangladesh, The Bangladesh Code in 38 volumes was completed. It is during this time that Anti-Corruption Commission was given complete independence. The Election Commission was strengthened.

Barrister Hosein put on record the role he tried to play during the caretaker government by publishing a book entitled 'গণতদ্বের সাফল্য চাহিয়াছি' (Wanted Success of Democracy).

Faculty

Mohammed Abdul Baten

ohammed Abdul Baten, Lecturer at School of Environmental Science and Management, has been awarded with post graduate degree from University of Stockholm in 2009 with MSc in Ecosystems, Governance and Globalization. Having primary background in Forestry and Environmental Science from University of Chittagong, Mr. Baten received his BSc and MSc degree in 2006 and 2007 respectively.

Mr. Baten started his career with Stockholm Environment Institute (SEI) in 2008 as a Research Assistant in their European Mangrove Project. During this tenure he conducted research on Mahakam Delta, Indonesia. He also wrote his MS thesis on the Mahakam Delta focusing property rights. Later in 2009, he



returned Bangladesh and joined Unnayan Onneshan, a multidisciplinary research organization, in Climate Change, Biodiversity and DRR unit. Prior to joining IUB in 2011, Mr. Baten's professional career was further enriched with consultancy in IUCN, joint research with International Indigenous Forum on Biodiversity and some other local and international organizations.

Mr. Baten has written couple of peer reviewed journal articles, conference proceedings, occasional papers, book chapters, popular articles. Mr. Baten has been engaged with UN CBD as Local Community Representative; correspondingly attending UN meetings and contributing to the international environmental policy making. Mr. Baten traveled more than 15 countries, covering 5 continents, to present his research works in international conferences, seminars and workshops. He was the youngest plenary speaker in the history of UNCBD, who presented his research work on Sundarbans in UNCBD SBSTTA-15 in 2011 at Montreal, Canada.

Mr. Baten's research interest pertains to livelihood, food security, natural resources management, management of social-ecological systems, gender issues, climate change, adaptation, common property resources management as they relate to the issue of sustainability. Currently, he is focusing on international environmental negotiations. He is actively involved with 10 (C) network of CBD and as a designated expert has contributed to the formulation of new programme of work on Customary Sustainable Use of Biodiversity under UNCBD. Mr. Baten also has started a monthly policy brief series on climate negotiation titled "Durban to Doha" and first issue already published.
