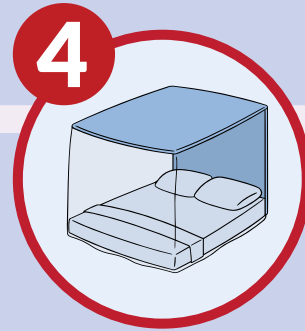

Research for a Greener Future

Artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning-based simulations developed by three undergraduate students of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE) at Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) suggest that solar panel efficiency could be increased significantly compared to the existing 15%.

Silicon-based thin-film solar cells, widely used globally, convert only about 15% of sunlight into electricity because silicon reflects approximately 30% of incoming light. The IUB student researchers – all third-year students – demonstrated in their simulations that metal nanoparticles, such as silver, aluminum, and titanium, under the proper conditions can absorb more solar energy than silicon if arranged in specific clusters and protected from oxidation. The team consists of

and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the world's largest technical professional organization dedicated to advancing technology for the benefit of humanity. Their research papers are currently indexed in

sunlight into electricity. If we can increase this amount appreciably, it would significantly boost our national power generation capacity," said Abyaz Karim, a member of the team.

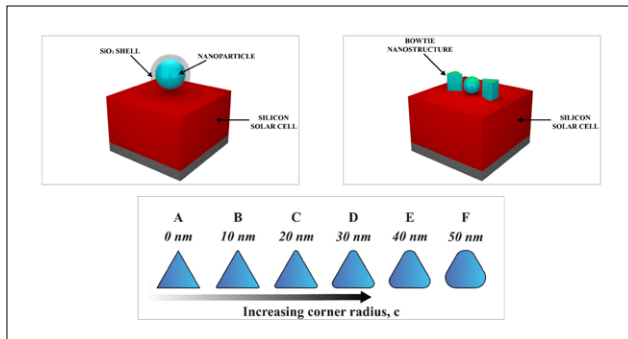
Photonics Simulation Laboratory (IUBPSL), where the simulations and algorithms were developed using the state-of-the-art ANSYS-Lumerical software suite.

In 2024, the students published their research in two peer-reviewed conferences sponsored by the Institute of Electrical

SCOPUS and the IEEE Xplore digital library.

“In simple terms, we are exploring ways to improve light absorption and current generation in solar cells. Currently, Bangladesh has about six million solar home panels, but they are highly inefficient, converting only 15% of

Compared to silicon nanoparticles, which lack free electrons, metal nanoparticles exhibit stronger plasmonic resonance due to their free electrons. These electrons collectively oscillate in response to electromagnetic waves (such as light), thus creating the conditions for increased light absorption into solar cells and thereby increased electrical current generation by the solar cells when excited by light. However, exposure to the atmosphere causes oxidation, forming an insulating oxide layer on the metal nanoparticles that reduces free electron mobility and inhibits current generation.

“Our simulations show that coating metal nanoparticles with a thin glass layer prevents oxidation by blocking atmospheric elements. This allows us to design thin-film solar cell structures using plasmonic metal core-dielectric shell nanoparticles that are significantly more efficient than silicon-based films,” said Sajid Ahmed Chowdhury, second member of the team.

The students further demonstrated through high-end simulations on the ANSYS-Lumerical software suite that the current generation capacity increases when metal nanoparticles with specific shapes are arranged in clusters. They explored the effectiveness of a “bow tie” formation, using two triangular nanoparticles and a circular one in the middle.

“Our second study shows that the sharpness of metal nanoparticle edges

plays a crucial role in enhancing solar cell efficiency. By fine-tuning their shape, we found that rounded edges improve light absorption, boosting current generation by over 50% – a promising step toward more efficient and cost-effective thin-film solar cells,” said A.F.M. Afnan Uzzaman Sheikh, the third member of the team. The team is now developing an AI and machine-learning-based algorithm to analyze a significantly larger dataset – including a wide range of nanoparticle dimensions – to identify the most efficient configurations.

“This project was originally intended as a final-year design project, a key requirement of IEB-BAETE-accredited B.Sc. in EEE program. It’s remarkable that these students not only made such significant progress in their third year – more than a year ahead of schedule – but

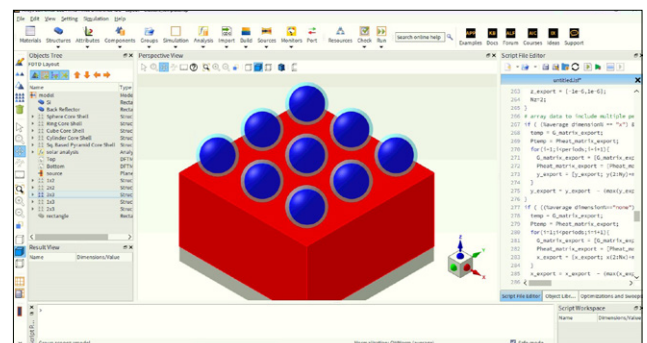
also published their findings in SCOPUS-indexed publications,” said Dr. Mustafa Habib Chowdhury, their supervisor. “At the IUB Photonics Simulation Laboratory [IUBPSL], we invested in the advanced ANSYS-Lumerical software suite to build a research group focused on designing high-efficiency solar cells that are engineered at the nanoscale level using metal nanoparticles and other novel nanostructures and nanomaterials. This research demonstrates the impact of that investment, and we hope the global renewable energy industry embraces these innovations by our students,” Dr. Chowdhury added.

Vice Chancellor Prof. M. Tamim, a leading energy expert, said, “Solar energy is the most abundant renewable resource, and improving its efficiency is critical in the fight against global warming. This research by IUB

students demonstrates how innovative solutions can emerge when young minds are given the right environment to explore. At IUB, we emphasize research-driven learning, and it is encouraging to see students engaging with real-world challenges so early in their academic journey.”

IUB’s B.Sc. in EEE is the only such program in Bangladesh to have received a five-year accreditation from the Board of Accreditation for Engineering and Technical Education (BAETE) of the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB) under the latest BAETE Manual version 2.1.

With this accreditation, the program aligns with the Washington Accord, enhancing global recognition and enabling graduates to pursue international career opportunities and professional registration without additional qualifications. •

IUB Trustee Mohammad Zakaria Khan has been elected as the Chairman of the Education Science Technology and Cultural Development Trust (ESTCDT) for a period of two years starting January 2025. Trustee Dr. Husne Ara Ali has been elected as the Vice Chairman of the trust for the same two-year period.

Mr. Khan replaces Trustee Nilufer Zafarullah, while Dr. Husne Ara Ali replaces Trustee Salma Karim. The election for the positions were held in the last week of December 2024 during which they were elected unanimously. ESTCDT was established in 1992 as a philanthropic

body with a strong commitment to take Bangladesh's higher education to global standards. Under ESTCDT, Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) was founded in 1993 in Dhaka and the Chittagong Independent University (CIU) in 1999.

Mohammad Zakaria Khan, born in 1950, graduated from the Department of English at the University of Dhaka in 1974. While at university, he joined his father Late Fazlur Rahman Khan's business. He now serves as Chairman and Managing Director of Commander Soap Co. Ltd. (COSCO), Goldhill Chemical Complex Ltd.,

Tiger Wire Products Ltd., Haque Plastic Ltd., and Sikander Industries Ltd.

Mr. Khan is also the Founder Director of NRBC Bank Ltd. and Federal Insurance Co. Ltd. He was also the founder Managing Director of Channel 9 and served for 19 years as the publisher and editor of the now-defunct national daily Bangla Bazar Patrika. His late wife, Dr. Benajir Durdana, was a Professor of English at the University of Dhaka and a Foundation Donor of IUB.

Dr. Husne Ara Ali is an accomplished academic and researcher. She is the

daughter of Late National Professor Dr. Md Innas Ali, the first Rector of IUB. She holds PhD and MPhil degrees in Pharmacy from the University of Dhaka. She has been serving as a member trustee of IUB since 2008, the founding trustee of the National Professor Dr. M. Innas Ali Memorial Trust of the Bangladesh Academy of Sciences, Founding Trustee of Rowshan Innas Ali Welfare Trust Fund, Dhaka University, and Primary Member of the Committee of Action for Research, Extension and Services (CARES), Dhaka.

Dr. Ali is an active researcher with published work in international journals and a philanthropist. An amateur artist and writer, she has held numerous art exhibitions and published 20 short pieces. Her husband Late Mr. A. H. M. Ershad Ali was a civil engineer who graduated from BUET in 1963 batch and retired as the Chief Engineer of BADC. She is also a mother of two medical specialists, Dr. Maleka Ali and Dr. Md. Asif Ali. •

Prof. M. Tamim joins Independent University, Bangladesh as Vice Chancellor



Prof. M. Tamim, distinguished professor of petroleum and mineral resources engineering, joined Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) as the Vice Chancellor on December 23, 2024.

According to a circular from the Ministry of Education dated December 17, 2024, the Hon'ble President of the People's Republic of Bangladesh and Chancellor of Universities appointed Prof. Tamim as the Vice Chancellor of IUB for a four-year term.

Before joining IUB, he served as a Professor of Petroleum and Mineral

Resources Engineering and Dean of the Faculty of Chemical and Materials Engineering at the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET).

Prof. Tamim earned his bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from BUET, completed his master's degree at the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras (IIT-Madras), and obtained his Ph.D. in Petroleum Engineering from the University of Alberta, Canada.

Prof. Tamim's research interests span reservoir engineering, energy economics, regulation and

planning, development and application of numerical and analytical computer models, and reservoir management.

He has also worked extensively on greenhouse gas (GHG) mitigation, energy efficiency improvements, and energy-related environmental solutions.

Over his career, he has supervised numerous M.Sc. students and published extensively in national and international journals.

Since 1995, Prof. Tamim has held a number of different positions related to energy policy

formulation, planning, and regulation under successive governments.

He took a one-year leave from academia to manage the Power and Energy Ministry during the tenure of the caretaker government in 2008.

He also briefly served as the Pro-Vice Chancellor of BRAC University from 2019 to 2020.

Prof. Tamim is a member and the founding Chairperson of the Society of Petroleum Engineers (SPE), Bangladesh Section, and a Life Fellow of the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB). •

Reducing inequality requires empathy

An Interview with Mr. Didar A Husain, Chairman of the IUB Board of Trustees

32 years ago, IUB was founded with a vision. How much of that vision has been achieved?

Our founder Dr. A Majeed Khan envisioned a private university that fosters knowledge, critical thinking, and prepares students for the future. His motto for IUB – Teacheth man that which he knew not, derived from the Holy Qur'an – embodies this commitment. From the start, trustees decided that no one would profit from the university. Education should not be a business. Every financial resource is reinvested into the university to enhance academic excellence. In a world increasingly driven by technology, we must ensure that our students are prepared to compete globally. We are emphasizing fields like Data Science to help bridge that gap.

Many private universities struggle with quality. How does IUB maintain standards?

It starts with our commitment to hiring and retaining outstanding faculty members. A strong

faculty leads to well-prepared graduates. We always prioritize quality over quantity, and that focus remains unwavering. Additionally, every revenue generated is reinvested into improving educational quality, rather than personal profits for the trustees.

Private universities are criticized for high tuition fees. What is IUB doing to address this?

Private universities worldwide tend to have higher costs due to the absence of government funding. However, IUB offers tuition waivers and scholarships for deserving students, especially those from outside Dhaka. Our residential facility Saima Hall provides free accommodation and education to female students from disadvantaged backgrounds. One such student recently graduated as the top achiever at the 25th Convocation.

Is IUB ready to offer PhD programs?

We welcome this move. But to make it meaningful, research must be of international quality. Without global recognition, PhD degrees will hold little value. That is why we are significantly increasing research funding, reallocating resources where necessary, and committing to a long-term strategy for strengthening our research ecosystem.

What can be done to mitigate the Industry-academia gap?

Historically, business and education have operated separately in our society. This must change. I saw in Korea how universities analyze global trends, develop solutions, and collaborate with industries. Faculty members benefit financially, industries gain valuable research, and universities establish themselves as key players in innovation.

What does the future hold for IUB?

Our dream is a campus that rivals those in the West – complete with residential halls for students and faculty, sports facilities, and green spaces. We have already acquired almost 100 bighas of land in Purbachal and plan to expand further to 150 bighas. In 5-7 years, we hope to initiate the work for establishing a modern, fully-equipped campus that will serve as a model for higher education in Bangladesh.

Any final thoughts?

Society thrives when everyone has an opportunity. We must support those who are less fortunate. That is why, during the recent 25th Convocation, we handed the graduates an envelope containing a token amount for themselves and an equal amount as empathy for an underprivileged person of his or her choice. The idea, simply said, is compassion and fellow-feeling. •



Prof. Niaz Zaman wins Ekushey Padak 2025

Professor Niaz Zaman, a distinguished educationist, author, and translator, and the Advisor to the Department of English and Modern Languages at IUB, has won the Ekushey Padak 2025 for her outstanding contributions to the field of education and literary studies.

Dr. Muhammad Yunus, Chief Advisor to the Government of Bangladesh, presented the Ekushey Padak 2025 to Prof. Zaman on February 20, 2025, in Dhaka.

Prof. Zaman completed her M.A. in English from University of Dhaka in 1963, followed by a 2nd M.A. from the American University in Washington, D.C., and a Ph.D. from the George

Washington University in 1987. She began her teaching career at Viqarunnisa Noon School, Holy Cross College, and University of Chittagong. In 1972, she joined the Department of English at the University of Dhaka, where she taught until retirement in 2013. She joined IUB's Department of English and Modern Languages in 2006.

She has published 3 novels, 3 short story collections, and 7 children's books. Her academic contributions include *A Divided Legacy: The Partition in Selected Novels of India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh*, which received multiple awards.

She also explored the textile heritage through works



like *The Art of Kantha Embroidery and Textiles from Bengal: A Shared Legacy*.

Unfettered, her translation of Kazi Nazrul Islam's *Bandhon Hara*, brought Bengali literature to wider audiences. Prof. Zaman edited significant anthologies, such as *1971 and After: Selected*

Stories and The Demoness: Best Bangladeshi Stories 1971–2021.

Her achievements have been recognized with Bangla Academy Award for Translation (2016), Anannya Sahitya Puroshkar (2013), and American Alumni Association Award for Education (2017). •

Times Higher Education Interdisciplinary Science Rankings 2025

IUB joint top private university in Bangladesh

Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) achieved the joint top spot among private universities in Bangladesh in the prestigious Times Higher Education (THE) Interdisciplinary Science Rankings 2025. IUB was placed in the 401-500 bracket globally and ranked fifth among all public and private universities in the country.

The rankings, released by THE, assess universities' contributions to interdisciplinary science across three key pillars:

inputs (funding), processes (institutional support), and outputs (research quality and reputation). The Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), USA topped the global list, followed by Stanford University, USA and the National University of Singapore.

THE's methodology incorporates 11 performance indicators, analyzing data from 157 million citations, 18 million research publications, and survey responses from over 20,000 scholars worldwide. This comprehensive

approach provides a detailed understanding of universities' capabilities in fostering interdisciplinary research.

Khandker Md Iftexhar Haider, former Vice Chancellor (Acting) of IUB, expressed his pride in the university's achievement, saying, "This recognition underscores IUB's commitment to interdisciplinary research and academic excellence. It reflects the hard work of our faculty, researchers, and students in contributing to cutting-edge knowledge that addresses real-world challenges."

IUB's placement reflects its growing focus on academic excellence and interdisciplinary research, aligning with international standards. The university continues to strengthen its position as a leader in higher education in Bangladesh. •

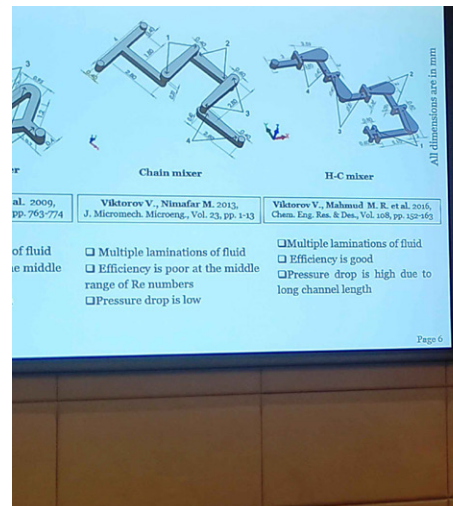
Breakthroughs Across Disciplines

Independent University, Bangladesh continues to make significant strides in research across diverse fields, from solar energy innovations to climate change education and academic publishing. Here's a detailed overview of the latest research activities.

EEE Graduates Publish in Heliyon

Four recent graduates from IUB's Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE) have published an original research paper in Heliyon, a high-impact, Scopus-indexed, Q1-ranked international journal.

The paper, titled "Particle Swarm Optimization for Performance Enhancement of Cadmium Telluride Thin-Film Solar Cells by Embedded Nano-Grating Structures with a Plasmonic Metal Coating Layer", was published on October 15, 2024. The research addresses the challenges of low light absorption and efficiency in cadmium telluride (CdTe) thin-film solar cells. By embedding nano-grating structures with a

plasmonic metal coating, the team demonstrated improved opto-electronic performance.

The authors – Rifat Bin Sultan (currently pursuing a PhD at UC Davis, USA), Asif Al Suny (Adjunct Faculty, IUB), and Md. Hasibul Hossain and Tazrian Noor (Research Assistants at the IUB Photonics Simulation Laboratory) – completed this work as part of their Final Year Design Project (FYDP). Supervised by Dr. Mustafa Habib Chowdhury, Head of the EEE Department, the project was supported by IUB's funding for ANSYS-Lumerical software.

Micromixer Innovation

Dr. Md Readul Mahmud, Associate Professor in the Department of Physical Sciences at IUB, presented his research on micromixer technology at the 10th Asia Conference on Mechanical Engineering and Aerospace Engineering (MEAE 2024) in Taicang, China, from October 18-20, 2024.

His paper, "Design and Numerical Analysis of a Split-and-Recombined '(Y-H)' Micromixer", introduces an innovative design for efficient fluid mixing in microfluidic systems, critical for chemical and biomedical applications. MEAE 2024,

hosted by Northwestern Polytechnical University, facilitated global knowledge exchange through keynote speeches, panel discussions, and interactive sessions.

ACCESS4ALL

On January 8, 2025, IUB co-hosted a Progress Sharing and Platform Introduction event for the ACCESS4ALL (Adapting Climate Change Education Skills and Sustainability for Advancing Locally-Led Solutions) initiative. ACCESS4ALL, funded by Erasmus+ CBHE, focuses on developing locally-led climate education solutions through collaborative research.

During the event, researchers presented their findings on innovative approaches to climate change education. The project emphasizes co-creating short-course curricula, building capacity for Bangladeshi universities, and integrating climate challenges into higher education. The shared research highlighted strategies to equip communities with skills for local climate adaptation, including community engagement and policy integration.

IUB researchers contributed insights into the development of South-led curricula and shared case studies on effective educational interventions. Collaborative publications with Maastricht and Heidelberg universities were also announced, underscoring the global reach of the initiative.

Prof Dr. Mamun Habib Appointed CRC Press Editor

Prof. Dr. Md. Mamun Habib, Head of the Department of General Management at IUB, was been appointed Book Series Editor by CRC Press, a leading academic publisher under the

Taylor & Francis Group. His series, Sustainable Industry-Focused Supply Chain Management, will publish two books annually, exploring topics like green logistics, low-carbon logistics, and the circular economy.

Prof. Habib, with over 250 research publications and 80 international keynote addresses, aims to advance sustainable practices aligned with the UN's SDGs. He emphasized the importance of contributing to industry and academia through innovative supply chain research.

Academic Publishing Insights

The Department of Accounting at IUB's School of Business and Entrepreneurship (SBE) organized a workshop titled "The Road to

Publications: Things We Need to Know" on November 14, 2024.

Dr. Shahzad Uddin, Professor at Essex Business School and Director of the Centre for Accountability and Global Development, led the session. He provided strategies for successful journal submissions, responding to peer reviews, and identifying high-impact journals. The event drew faculty from SBE and SLASS, fostering interdisciplinary dialogue on research publication challenges and opportunities.

Research Methodology Workshop

The Independent Economic Society of IUB organized a research methodology workshop

on December 4, 2024. Prof. Dr. Raisul Awal Mahmood, Dean (Acting) of the School of Business and Entrepreneurship, conducted the session, focusing on equipping students with tools for reliable research.

Prof. Mahmood covered research approaches, sampling techniques, literature reviews, and ethical considerations. He demonstrated modern data analysis tools and emphasized the importance of using credible sources while avoiding unreliable information. The session provided practical insights into conducting structured, unbiased research.

These recent achievements reflect IUB's growing commitment to impactful, cross-disciplinary research with global relevance. •

Bridging the Gap

CSE on-campus recruitment

The Department of Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) at IUB, along with its club JUKTI and the External Outreach Office, organized two On-Campus Internship Recruitment Programs. The first, held from September 23 to 26, 2024, connected 51 students with nine top IT companies. The second, from January 13 to 16, 2025, involved 117 final-year students and 11 leading firms. Participants underwent rigorous training in technical and soft skills before presenting themselves for roles like game, web, mobile app developers, and data analysts. Employers praised the students' preparedness, while many participants secured valuable

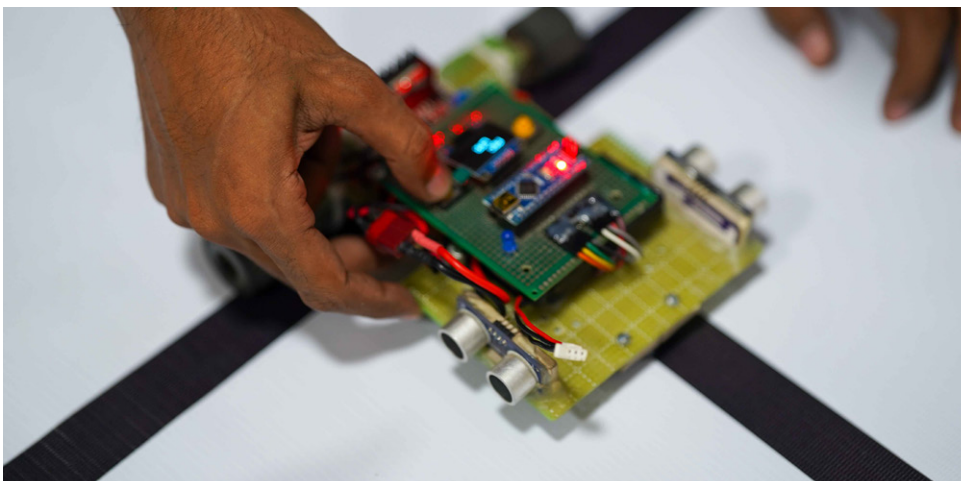

ESG Director, Farhana Islam Teresa, attended as the Chief Guest, alongside IUB's leadership and alumni. The fest highlighted the importance of collaborative innovation in addressing real-world technical challenges.

Career Seminar on Healthcare Tech

The Office of Career Guidance, Placement, and Alumni Relations (CGP&AR) partnered with the Independent HR Society (IHRs) to host a seminar titled "Hiring Hacks: Your Path to Augmedix" on November 25, 2024.

The event attracted 253 students and alumni interested in healthcare technology. Representatives from Augmedix Bangladesh discussed AI-driven

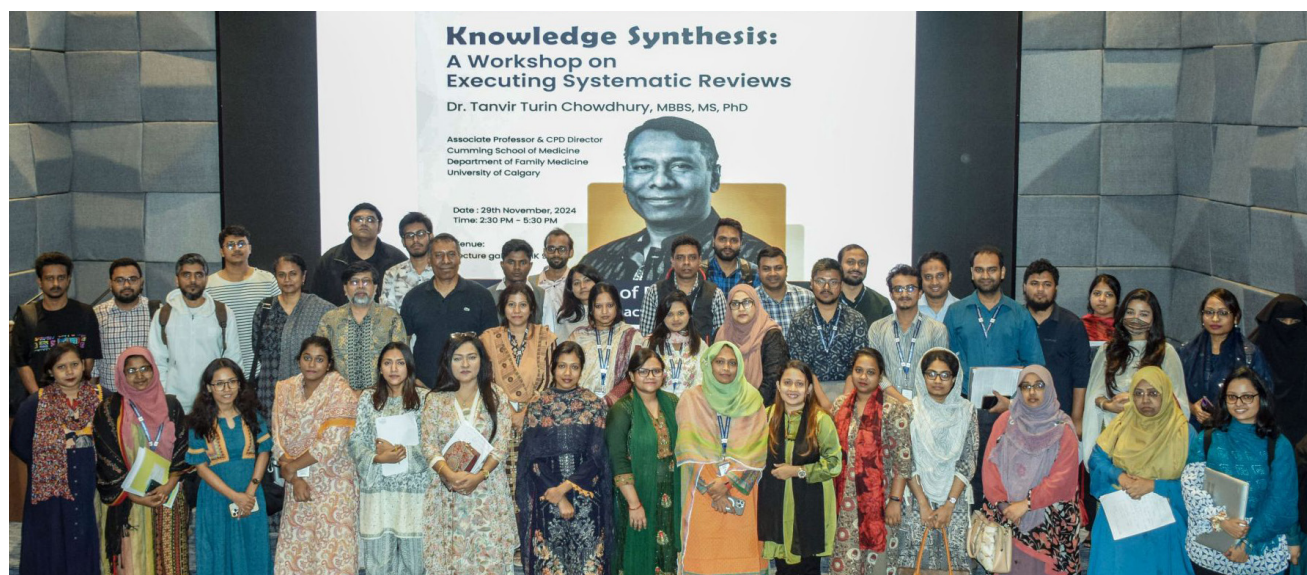

Participants will join follow-up webinars in 2025, culminating in a certificate upon submitting a reflective essay. •

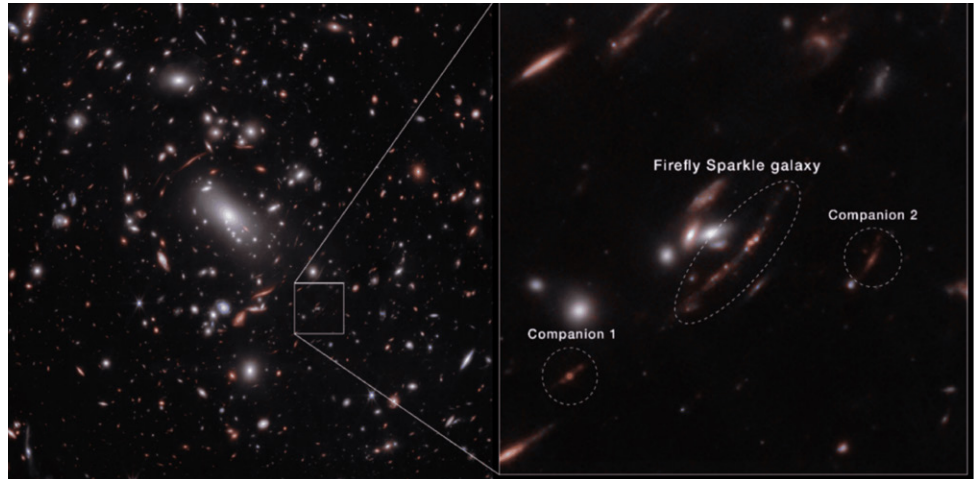
IUB's Cosmic Quest: Milestones in Astronomy Research

IUB made significant strides in the field of astronomy through its proposed Center for Astronomy, Space Science, and Astrophysics (CASSA). From publishing groundbreaking research in *Nature* to hosting engaging public outreach exhibitions and research seminars, IUB has emerged as a hub for astrophysical exploration in Bangladesh. Here is a chronological overview of the university's key astronomy-related activities.

Durbin Exhibition

On October 31, 2024, IUB hosted the inaugural Durbin Exhibition as part of Astronomy Night 8. The event showcased 37 images of celestial objects, arranged according to their distance from the Earth. The photographs, captured by national volunteers over 18 months, ranged from nearby planets to galaxies 60 million light-years away.

The event featured two Equinox Unistellar telescopes – advanced smart telescopes suitable for astronomy education and outreach – gifted to IUB by the Dunlap Institute for Astronomy & Astrophysics, University of Toronto. The top prize for the best image went to Md Shahadat Hossain Shahal, a Computer Science and Engineering major pursuing a minor in Astronomy and Astrophysics.

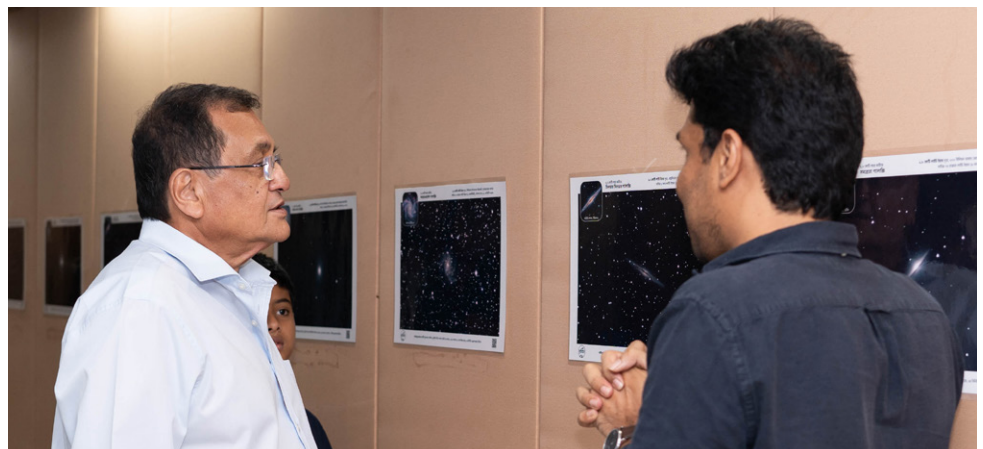
Special Astronomy Night for Trustees

On November 3, 2024, Durbin IUB organized an exclusive Astronomy Night for the Trustees and their families. The event included a presentation by Dr. Asad on IUB's astronomy initiatives, followed by stargazing using smart telescopes.

Despite partial cloud cover, attendees observed celestial objects like the Ring Nebula and the Pleiades cluster. Trustees commended the astronomy team's dedication, while Acting Dean of SETS, Dr. Habib Bin Muzaffar, pledged continued support for the program's growth.

Lamiya Mowla publishes in *Nature*

On December 13, 2024, *Nature* published a research paper co-authored by Dr. Lamiya Mowla, an Assistant Professor at Wellesley College, USA, and an associate member of IUB's proposed CASSA. The paper details the discovery of "Firefly Sparkle," a galaxy that formed approximately 600 million

years after the Big Bang – when the universe was less than 5% of its current age.

Dr. Mowla and her international team utilized data from NASA’s James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) and gravitational lensing to identify the galaxy and its companion galaxies, “Firefly-Best Friend” and “Firefly-New Best Friend.” The magnification of light by up to 26 times revealed 10 compact star clusters within “Firefly Sparkle.”

“Light from ‘Firefly Sparkle’ took 13.2 billion years to reach us,” said Dr. Mowla. “If we could observe it as it is today, it would likely resemble the Milky Way.”

Dr. Khan Muhammad Bin Asad, Assistant Professor of Physical Sciences at IUB, who is currently leading the CASSA project, emphasized the importance of the discovery: “This research highlights our ambition to position IUB as a pioneer in astronomy research in Bangladesh.”

Lecture on Early Galaxy Formation

Following the *Nature* publication, Dr. Mowla visited IUB on December 19, 2024, to deliver a lecture during the 2nd Colloquium of the proposed CASSA. The event attracted nearly 100 participants, including university students and even a high school student.

Dr. Mowla used the Cosmic Calendar to contextualize cosmic history and explained how JWST’s high-resolution imaging revealed the structure of ancient galaxies like “Firefly

Sparkle.” She highlighted findings from her research, including the detection of young star clusters with low metallicity, indicating their primordial nature.

The presentation also covered the implications of the Initial Mass Function (IMF) findings, which suggest variations from established models. The colloquium marked the first instance of a CASSA-affiliated researcher’s work being featured in a high-impact scientific journal.

Lecture on Hubble Tension

On January 5, 2025, the proposed CASSA hosted its 3rd Colloquium, featuring a lecture by Syed Ashraf Uddin from the University of South Carolina, USA. His presentation focused on the Hubble Constant and the unresolved “Hubble Tension,” which arises from discrepancies in measurements of the universe’s expansion rate.

Uddin discussed the cosmic distance ladder, dark matter,

dark energy, and the “dark ages” of cosmic history. He also shared insights from the Carnegie Supernova Project, which achieved a 1.5% precision in calculating the Hubble Constant. His lecture highlighted the use of AI in future cosmological studies.

Following the talk, Uddin met IUB Vice Chancellor Prof. M. Tamim, and expressed his appreciation for IUB’s unique role in advancing astronomy education in Bangladesh.

Building the first Array Radio Telescope (ART) of Bangladesh

The first Array Radio Telescope (ART) of Bangladesh is being built by CASSA in collaboration with the Department of Physical Sciences (DPS) and Fab Lab IUB. Most of the funds has been provided by DPS, and Fab Lab IUB is building the array structure underlying the telescope. The concept of the telescope and its receiver electronics have been designed by a group in

the University of Otago, New Zealand, an active collaborator of CASSA. IUB purchased the antennas and receiver electronics from them which arrived at IUB in January.

The premises of CASSA is currently under construction and set to be finished within the next month. The ART that we are calling the Small Transient Array Radio Telescope (START) will be installed on an open area in front of the office of CASSA. Unlike the aforementioned smart outreach telescopes, START can be used for astronomy research, teaching and outreach alike.

Looking Ahead

With the establishment of the proposed CASSA, IUB is steadily building its capacity for astronomy education, research, and outreach. Through international collaborations, student engagement, and cutting-edge research, the university aims to contribute to global scientific efforts while fostering a community of aspiring astronomers in Bangladesh. •

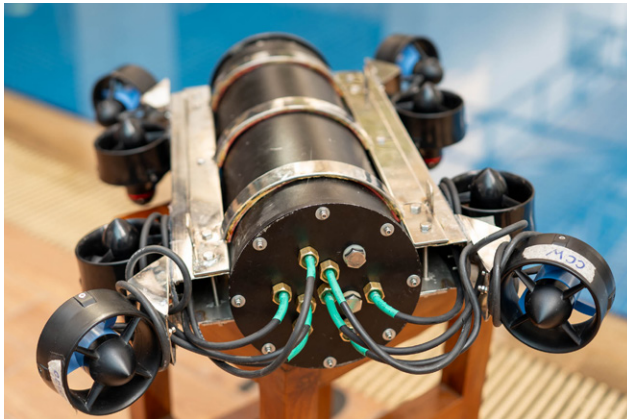

Underwater vehicle shows promise for industrial applications



The innovative autonomous underwater vehicle (AUV) developed by team IUB BongoMarine

A team of computer science and engineering students from Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) has developed an innovative autonomous underwater vehicle (AUV) with significant potential for industrial applications in fisheries, maritime ecology and security.

The device, created by IUB BongoMarine, has already earned recognition on the global stage, securing a spot at the prestigious Singapore Autonomous Underwater Vehicle Challenge (SAUVC) 2025.

The AUV, designed to navigate and perform complex tasks in challenging underwater environments, demonstrates versatility in applications such as fish population monitoring, underwater habitat mapping, marine debris management, maritime accident rescue operations, and naval security.

These capabilities position the project as a valuable innovation for addressing critical challenges in fisheries,

ecological preservation, and maritime safety. Scaling up the prototype for broader industrial use could unlock even more opportunities in these sectors.

“This device was developed after countless hours of research, prototyping, and testing,” said Noor-E Sadman, Team director of IUB BongoMarine. “It combines advanced navigation systems, machine learning algorithms, and precise mechanical engineering to operate effectively in extreme underwater conditions. We would be proud to see if this technology can be applied in industries that are vital to our economy. If scaled up, its impact could extend even further.”

The team comprises Tahfizul Hasan Zihan (Strategic and Hardware Lead), Rahat Hasan Shihab (Technical and Mechanical Lead), Md. Hana Sultan Chowdhury (System Integration Lead), Mukut Protim Memo (Fabrication Lead) and Md. Abdun Fattah Lam (Fabrication Co-Lead).

Their efforts were supported by IUB’s Center for Industrial Automation, Robotics and Internet of Things (RIoT Research Center), which provided technical guidance.

The AUV was designed and prototyped at Fab Lab IUB, a premier engineering fabrication facility that fosters innovation through cutting-edge technology and hands-on experimentation.

IUB Vice Chancellor Prof. M. Tamim lauded the team’s efforts. “This project exemplifies the innovative spirit of our students and highlights how academic institutions can contribute to solving real-world challenges. The AUV has the potential to make a significant impact in industries such as fisheries management, and maritime ecology and safety. I am proud to see IUB leading this effort. Scaling up this prototype could further enhance its industrial relevance.”

“It is a clear demonstration of how technical knowledge can be applied to create practical solutions,” said Dr. Saadia Binte Alam, Head of the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at IUB. “Our students have combined theoretical understanding with engineering

skills to tackle complex underwater challenges, showcasing their potential to contribute to advanced technological development both locally and globally.”

Dr. Mohammad Faisal Uddin, Director of the RIoT Research Center, praised the team’s achievement and underscored the potential applications of the project.

“The AUV developed by BongoMarine showcases the cutting-edge research and innovation happening at IUB. It has immense potential for industrial applications, especially in critical areas like underwater habitat mapping and rescue operations,” he said.

Dr. Mahady Hasan, Director of Fab Lab IUB, emphasized the lab’s commitment to nurturing future innovators, “At Fab Lab IUB, we empower students to turn their ideas into reality through cutting-edge prototyping and engineering solutions.”

He also said, “The success of this AUV project stands for the talent and dedication of our students, and we are excited to see its potential impact on industry and research.” •

IQAC advances quality assurance in higher education



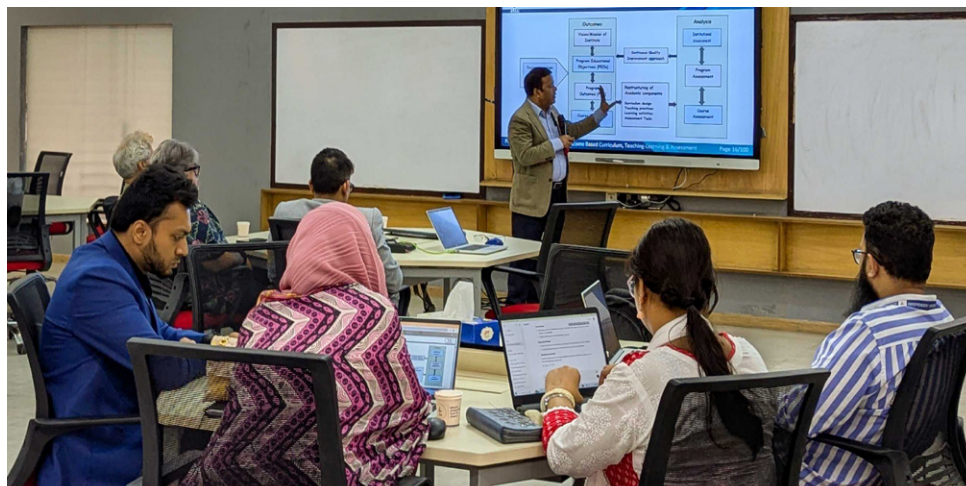

The Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB) has undertaken numerous initiatives to enhance the quality of education through workshops, collaborative meetings, and accreditation-focused activities. These initiatives are aimed at improving outcome-based teaching, learning, and assessment methodologies while strengthening institutional accreditation efforts at the national and international levels. In recent months, IQAC

workshops focused on outcome-based teaching, learning, and assessment. These workshops were tailored for various schools

within the university, including the School of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (SLASS), the School of Business

and Entrepreneurship (SBE), the School of Environmental and Life Sciences (SELS), the School of Engineering, Technology, and Sciences (SETS), the School of Pharmacy and Public Health (SPPH), and the Law program. Each session aimed to enhance faculty capacity in designing curriculum and assessment strategies aligned with program learning outcomes. To ensure continuous improvement, IQAC conducted workshops on preparing Self-Assessment Reports (SAR) for Bangladesh Accreditation Council (BAC) and



IQAC organized a workshop on "Outcome-Based Teaching-Learning and Assessment" for the undergraduate programs under the School of Engineering, Technology and Sciences on December 5, 2024



IQAC participated in two collaborative meetings with the Center for Teaching, Learning, and Technology and the Global Relations Office of the National University of Singapore on January 23, 2025

Board of Accreditation for Engineering and Technical Education (BAETE) accreditation. These sessions provided faculty members with the necessary skills to evaluate and document institutional strengths and areas for development.

It is worthwhile to mention that the B.Sc. in EEE Program of IUB received accreditation from BAETE which is recognized by the Washington Accord of the International Engineering Alliance (IEA) and all eight programs of the School of Business and Entrepreneurship (SBE) have received accreditation from the Accreditation Council for Business Schools Programs (ACBSP), an US-based accreditation organization.

Accord, to discuss global accreditation standards for engineering programs.

At the national level, IQAC actively participated in the Bangladesh Accreditation Council's (BAC) workshop on the Bangladesh National Qualification Framework (BNQF) and a University Grants Commission (UGC) consultation on faculty training modules. These engagements reflect the university's commitment to aligning with national quality assurance policies.

Dr. Md. Abdur Razzak, Director, IQAC and Professor of Electrical and Electrical Engineering at IUB, said, "So far, IQAC has extended its support to more than 20 public and private universities in Bangladesh and five universities abroad. Through its extensive workshops, collaborative meetings, and accreditation efforts, IQAC has demonstrated a strong commitment to advancing quality assurance in higher education." He also said, "By fostering outcome-based education and engaging in national and international accreditation discussions, the university is reinforcing its position as a leader in educational excellence." •

A leading theoretical physicist and author, Dr. Momen is expected to contribute to the promotion of Bengali language and literature. Established in 1955, Bangla Academy is the key institution for developing Bengali

language, literature, and culture, nurturing talent and conducting research on Bengali heritage.

Professor Dr. Ahmed Ahsanuzzaman, from the Department of English and Modern Languages, was appointed an academic auditor by the Bangladesh Accreditation Council (BAC) in February 2024. His appointment followed a comprehensive selection process. BAC, established by parliamentary



mandate, is responsible for providing Certificates of Accreditation to eligible higher education institutions (HEIs) and academic programs that meet rigorous quality standards. His appointment was made official by a BAC memo dated February 1, 2024.

Prof. Dr. Md. Mamun Habib, Head of the Department of General Management at Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB),



delivered a keynote address at the seminar "Mastering Compliance: Insights and Strategies for Sourcing and Sales Leaders in Responsible Textiles," held on January 15, 2025, at the International Convention City Bashundhara (ICCB), Dhaka. Prof. Habib presented on "9 Steps to Boost the Right Sourcing Strategy," highlighting the importance of sustainable sourcing and supply chain management in addressing procurement challenges, disruptions, and compliance requirements.

Earlier, on November 5, 2024, Prof. Habib



spoke at a seminar titled “Strengthening IPR Frameworks: Challenges and Way Forward,” was held at The Westin Dhaka, organized by the American Chamber of Commerce in Bangladesh (AmCham). He emphasized the need for greater intellectual property rights awareness within academia and industry.

Professor Dr. Shahriar Kabir, from the Department of Economics at IUB, is collaborating on a research project titled



“Bangladesh Innovation Policy Paper” with Dr. Carmello Ferlito, lead researcher of the project and CEO of Centre for Market Education (CME), Malaysia; and Dr. Mahfuz Kabir, Research Director at the Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BISS).

The project, commencing in February 2025 and continuing for five to eight months, is funded by CME.

The research aims to identify and analyze Bangladesh’s potential sectors and provide policy guidelines for their development.



Professor Dr. Md Hafizur Rahman, Head of the Department of Environmental Science and Management, delivered the keynote speech at the DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Alumni Association workshop titled “Advancement in Earth, Environment, Biodiversity, and Agricultural Sciences in Bangladesh.”

Organized by the Alumni Association of German Universities in Bangladesh, the event took place from November 1 to 3, 2024, at the BRAC CDM Rajendrapur in Gazipur. Dr. Rahman’s address focused on sustainable energy, highlighting key challenges and solutions for solar energy systems in Bangladesh’s coastal regions.

Dr. Marufa Akter, Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Global Studies & Governance, participated as an expert speaker at the Hanoi Dialogue on Regional Challenges, held from October 10-12, 2024, in Hanoi, Vietnam. Organized by the FES Asia Strategic Foresight Network, the event brought together experts and leaders from Bangladesh, India, South Korea, Japan, Mongolia,



and Vietnam to address shared challenges in geopolitics, geoeconomics, and sustainable development in a rapidly changing world.

Dr. Akter delivered a talk focusing on cooperation, building trust among nations, and developing innovative solutions to manage shifting geopolitical dynamics. Her insights emphasized the importance of collaborative regional efforts to address complex challenges.



Dr. Imran Firdaus, Assistant Professor of Media and Communication, was appointed to the Bangladesh National Film Grant Subcommittee. The announcement was made through a circular from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting on October 7, 2024. The 7-member subcommittee supports the 10-member National Film Grant Committee in overseeing government-funded film projects for the fiscal year 2024-25. The subcommittee’s duties include assessing the quality of incomplete films and recommending release of installments.

In October 2024, an article by Dr. Imran Firdaus, was featured in the limited edition Blu-ray release of Kim Ki-duk’s 2000 film, *The Isle*. This special edition Blu-ray is distributed by Umbrella Entertainment, an independent Australian enterprise known for local and international films. Dr.

Firdaus analyzes how Schiele's artistic vision informs Kim Ki-duk's approach to crafting a story that explores isolation, obsession, and the complexities of human relationships.

Dr. Md. Toriqul Islam, Assistant Professor in the Department of Law, published his first sole-authored book, *Regulatory Challenges of AI Governance in the Era of ChatGPT*, on December 11, 2024. It was released by Wolters Kluwer International,



Netherlands, a globally recognized publisher. The book examines the historical evolution of artificial intelligence (AI) with a focus on large language models (LLMs) such as ChatGPT. It explores the transformative potential of these technologies across various industries while addressing socio-ethical concerns, legal challenges, and misconceptions surrounding AI. The book also provides actionable recommendations for

policymakers, legal experts, academics, and technologists to guide responsible AI governance.



Dr. Zoha Rahman, Assistant Professor of Media and Communication, conducted a series of training sessions for Bangladesh Tourist Police in January 2025 at Police Headquarters, Dhaka. The sessions covered emerging technologies, AI, and big data analysis. The first session on January 2 focused on future trends in tourism. On January 9, she discussed AI applications for national security, including biometric techniques. The final session, held on January 25-26, introduced big data analytics to inspectors and sub-inspectors.

In December, she addressed an Academic Symposium marking 50 years of Marketing Education Practices in Bangladesh as the keynote speaker at University of Dhaka. She discussed the role of technology in marketing, focusing on the

use of Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence in marketing strategies and solutions. Based on her experience as a Big Data Scientist, she explained the need to include AI and ML applications in academic curriculums to prepare students for changes in marketing. She concluded with a discussion on Big Data analysis and its role in marketing practices.

Afnan Yusuf, Lecturer in the Department of Management at Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB), received an esteemed international research grant under the 2024-2025 Going Global Partnerships – Gender Equality Funding Grant in November 2024. The project, titled “Bridging the Gender Gap in Healthcare:



Addressing Disparities in Career Progression and Aspirations Among Women in Healthcare Professions in Bangladesh,” is a collaboration with Kenisha Linton-Williams, Associate Professor at the University of Greenwich,

UK. Funded by the British Council with a grant of £25,000, the research aims to address challenges faced by women in the healthcare sector, particularly in career progression and specialisation.

Israt Taslim, Lecturer at the Department of English and Modern Languages, conducted a workshop titled “Performance in the City and Autoethnographic



Research” at BRAC University on September 12, 2024. The workshop explored research possibilities in autoethnography within urban environments, focusing particularly on Dhaka and other post-industrial cities around the world. Taslim discussed key themes, including the experience economy, urban design, public movement, resistance – both collective and individual – artistic performances, and the historical transformation of public spaces. Practice-based research also formed a crucial part of the discussions. •

IUB alumni make strides in global research and innovation

Four IUB alumni have recently begun fully-funded PhD and postdoctoral programs at renowned institutions.



Dr. Jannatul Ferdous Rumky, an M.Sc. graduate in Environmental Management from IUB, began her postdoctoral research at Cornell University, USA, in October 2024.

Her project, titled “Sustainable Remediation: Upgrading Hydrothermally Carbonized Hydrochar into Activated Carbons for Semiconductor Industries Wastewater Treatment and Carbon Capture,” addresses critical environmental challenges in high-water-use industries. Dr. Jannatul, who completed her PhD at Lappeenranta-Lahti University of Technology

(LUT), Finland, in 2022, credits her success to her mentors, particularly at IUB.

She encourages aspiring researchers to leverage networking opportunities and remain committed to their academic pursuits.

Rashid Ahmed Rifat, a B.Sc. graduate in Electrical and Electronic Engineering from IUB,



commenced his fully-funded PhD at Vrije Universiteit Brussel, Belgium, in Spring 2024.

His research, funded by the EU’s Horizon Europe projects, focuses on improving Lithium-ion battery systems at the Battery Innovation Centre within the MOBI Electromobility Research Centre.

Rashid, a recipient of multiple academic honors

at IUB, previously secured the prestigious Erasmus Mundus Joint International Master’s Scholarship, allowing him to study across Europe. He emphasizes that his early research experiences at IUB played a key role in securing international opportunities.

Joyeeta Tahseen Khan, a graduate of IUB’s Department of Pharmacy, joined the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, USA, in August 2024 for a fully-funded PhD.

Working under Dr. Amit Tiwari, her research focuses on cancer drug discovery, development, and immunotherapy for progressive cancers. Joyeeta’s research journey



began at IUB, where she worked on diabetes treatment and medicinal plant studies. She later published in high-impact journals and won

international recognition. She aims to contribute to global pharmaceutical research, inspired by a personal experience with inadequate medication availability.

Md. Iftadul Islam Sakib, a former part-time lecturer



and graduate of IUB’s EEE Department, started his fully-funded PhD at VUB’s MOBI Research Centre in May 2024.

His research focuses on developing advanced prognostics for power electronics in electric vehicles.

Sakib, who earned his M.Sc. in EEE from IUB in 2020, previously worked at IUB’s Green Energy Research Center.

He attributes his success to the strong research foundation he built at IUB, encouraging students to focus on innovation despite resource limitations. •

Asraful Alam, Executive Engineer of the Bangladesh Water Development Board in Khulna, also presented findings on the challenges faced by polder communities in the region. The policy dialogue drew participants from various government departments, including environment,

agriculture, social services, women’s affairs, and youth development, alongside representatives from NGOs like Rupantar, DALIT, Parittran, and CARITAS. Members of the Dalit and Munda communities actively engaged in the discussions, raising concerns about fresh water shortages, child marriage, plastic pollution, and other socio-environmental challenges impacting their communities. •
