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Trending research topics on Outcome Based Education in Bangladesh: a bibliometric analysis based on Scopus data (1990-2026)

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Abstract

This study looks at publishing patterns, active contributors, important publications, and popular research topics in the field of outcome based education in Bangladesh. This study examined 470 Scopus papers between 1990 and 2026 to identify patterns, top articles, and trending topics. In this paper, the bibliometric analysis approach is carried out using R software. The study shows the yearly count of scientific articles published over a 36-year span (1990–2026). This study illustrates an analysis based on Bradford's Law, a bibliometric method employed to pinpoint the most significant or "core" journals within a particular research domain. PLOS ONE is the leading journal in this collection, accounting for 41 articles (about 32% of all essential articles). Bangladesh leads in overall articles (169, 36%), but has a moderate international collaboration rate (42.6% MCP). The study depicts that PROST A, 2013, LANCET has the most total citations (470) but a lower TC per Year (33.57).

1. Introduction

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) has become a commonly embraced framework in global educational systems, especially within vocational training programs (Levatino et al., 2024). OBE focuses on aligning curriculum, teaching methods, and assessments with well-defined learning outcomes (Zhao et al., 2023). Instead of mainly emphasizing instructional inputs like teaching hours or teacher qualifications, OBE prioritizes more on the abilities, understanding, and qualifications that students are anticipated to accomplish (Yongliang, 2023).

3. Results

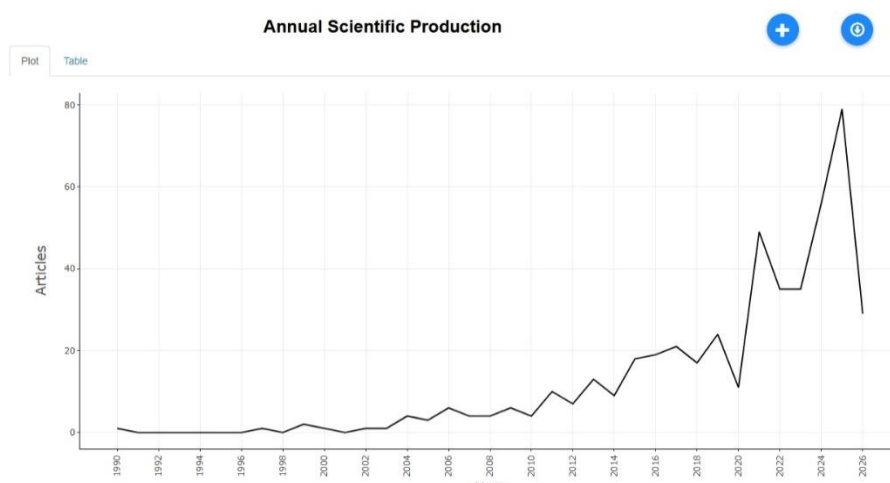


Fig.1 Trend

Overview of General Trends

1990 – 2003 (Dormant Phase): For more than ten years, research productivity in this particular area was almost absent, varying from 0 to 2 publications annually.

2004 – 2014 (Early Growth Phase): A slow yet erratic increase starts to take shape. The output remains under 15 articles each year, yet the "baseline" of research begins to increase.

2015 – 2020 (Acceleration Phase): Research interest increases notably, peaking at around 24 articles in 2019 before a sudden, brief decline in 2020 (possibly connected to global changes in research priorities during the pandemic).

Recent Increase (2021 – 2025)

The graph's most notable aspect is the exponential increase that began in 2021:

2021: A significant rise to almost 50 articles.

2024 – 2025 (Peak): The field attains its highest level in 2025 with around 78–80 articles published. This indicates a dynamic or swiftly advancing area of research.

The chart indicates a significant decrease in 2026, falling to roughly 30 articles.

This table illustrates an analysis based on Bradford's Law, a bibliometric method employed to pinpoint the most significant or "core" journals within a particular research domain. The table identifies the journals located in Zone 1, recognized as the Nucleus or core zone. Bradford's Law states that a research area is usually segmented into three zones, with each zone containing approximately one-third of all articles. Zone 1 includes a limited number of very productive journals that release the largest share of the literature. PLOS ONE is the leading journal in this collection, accounting for 41 articles (about 32% of all essential articles). This indicates that the research field has a significant footprint in extensive, multidisciplinary open-access publishing.

The table depicts that PROST A, 2013, LANCET has the most total citations (470) but a lower TC per Year (33.57) than the second paper, due to its earlier publication date (2013 vs. 2018). VOLGMAN AS, 2018, CIRCULATION boasts the highest TC per Year (47.33) and the highest Normalized TC (9.34), indicating it is particularly impactful compared to its discipline and year. Studies such as HAIDER R, 2000, LANCET and BHOPAL R, 2002, J PUBLIC HEALTH MED have a Normalized TC of 1.0, indicating the baseline (average anticipated citation impact for their field/year). JAFAR TH, 2020, NEW ENGL J MED shows robust TC per Year (30.57) and elevated Normalized TC (6.29), suggesting swift influence even though it is relatively new. HAMID MO, 2013 has a moderate overall citation count (166), yet its Normalized TC stands at 1.75, just a bit above the average.

4. Conclusion

Outcome come based education one of the emerging topics in education sector. Based on data set, the study depicts publication trends, top contributing countries, most cited papers, top publishing journals, collaborating authors and emerging key words based on word clouding.

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
