Abstract

As an intern at ADN Diginet, I had an opportunity to acquire valuable knowledge and connect theoretical knowledge with practical experience. As a data analyst intern, I was enrolled in the "Hire and Train" program in their EDGE (Enhancing Digital Government Economy) project. This program is sponsored by the Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC) and IIT, University of Dhaka. Initially, I had been trained in data analytics and learned data visualization using Microsoft powerBI software and worked on various projects to design CXO dashboards. Simultaneously, I was assigned to work on the backend and frontend with the customer module team to build an e-commerce website that they would launch in the future.

Ultrashop is an e-commerce website that aims in solving the problems faced in the traditional e-commerce platforms in Bangladesh. The website allows customers to buy their desired products online. Customers can also add the products they want to buy in the future to their wishlist and can view their order history. The website would implement a virtual trial for customers which would be done by the Machine Learning team. Additionally, customers can also choose their desired delivery method -online or pick up from the store. Chapter 1

Introduction

1.1 Overview/Background of the Work

Ultrashop is an e-commerce platform where users can purchase their desired products easily. However, it is not just any other e-commerce platform. It has a variety of brands available so products from different brands will be under one umbrella now and it would make it easier for the customers to get all the products from different places at one platform. By making sure that the UX is easy to navigate, Ultrashop ensures customers have a smooth browsing experience. It also has pickup options so that customers can also pick up the product by themselves if they want to. Moreover, the company plans to add more features to enhance the project even more. For example, they want to introduce a virtual trial system, an analytical report based on the products and provide business solutions, they also want to incorporate more languages, etc.

1.2 Objectives

The objective of this project is to make it easier for customers to make purchases. Moreover, as it is a generic project, it is easily customizable as per the requirements from different clients. Now, similar projects would not have to be coded from scratch and it would save both time and cost. Customers can also have multiple shipping addresses. More objectives include:

- ^ User interface that is easily customizable.
- ^ User interface to be easy to navigate.
- ^ Viewing the latest products first.
- ^ Less complex designs so that users can easily understand where to navigate.
- ^ Reuse components of the code

1.3 Scopes

The scope of the project is to build a generic e-commerce website so that each time an e-commerce project has to be implemented, the technical team would not have to start coding from scratch again. Also, it is easily customizing so clients can add more requirements and decide on which features they want. Hence, there are many scopes of this project.

- { Users can now easily understand the location.

- ^ Sign up:

- { Allows users to sign up easily.
- { Strong passwords are required.

- ^ Filtering Products by brand/category:

- { Users can easily find the products based on their desired brand or category.
- { Optimizes the browsing for users.

- ^ Viewing Product Details:

- { Users can see the details of the products with multiple images of the product and specifications as well as quantity.

Chapter 2

Literature Review

2.1 Relationship with Undergraduate Studies

The knowledge and skills gathered throughout my undergraduate studies has helped me in my internship. The programming course helped to build up programming skills and learn the basics to the advanced level. Since most of the programming courses had group projects, meeting deadlines, working with a team and building project management skills as well as communication with teammates was helpful in the workplace since I had to work in teams there as well. The projects in the courses helped me to choose a career in software development and understand the gist of software development. The following courses have been directly relevant to my internship project.

- ^ CSE303(Database Management) : The main objective of this course was for us to be able to design a website connecting both back-end and front-end while also designing the database and learning the fundamentals of database management. The project of this course helped us to get the full knowledge about how a website is designed from scratch.
- ^ CSE309 (Web Applications and Internet) :We have learned to design a website using HTML, CSS and implement it by using PHP, or Django for the back-end. The assignments in this course helped us to understand the technologies and to enhance our skills in web development and designing as well.
- ^ CSE307 (System Analysis and Design) : This course has helped in understanding how a system should be analyzed before designing it and also after the implementation. It has helped in understanding how the requirements of a system could be met. Moreover, the assignments in this course helped us to learn how to document each segment of the system so that the gap between technical and non-technical people can be reduced.
- ^ CSE203+L (Data Structure) :In this course, the various types of data structures are taught in depth. The concepts of each of these structures helped to understand how to optimize the code.

2.2 Related works

Since there are many e-commerce websites used now in Bangladesh which are similar to Ultrashop, some of the websites have been discussed below.

- ^ Shopify online e-commerce website : In this research, a website called "Shopify" was built to understand the methodology of an e-commerce website. Bootstrap, HTML5, and CSS3 were used to design the frontend. For the database, MySQL was used and for the backend, they have used Django. Shopify carries out the basic operations of an e-commerce website such as buying, selling, making payments.[1].
- ^ Design of e-commerce website based on Django : HTML and Javascript was used to implement the frontend of the system while python with Django was used for the backend. The user searches for the data and imports it into the MySQL database, which is then used to create the system's database and allow for the integration and modification of the data. This paper focuses on the basic operations of an e-commerce website i.e. order processing, ordering, buying.[2]
- ^ Using the Django framework for e-commerce processes : This paper discusses the implementation of websites using django which uses the MVC framework. It also describes the concept of classes in Django.[3]

Chapter 3

Project Management & Financing

3.1 Work Breakdown Structure

A work breakdown structure is a tool that offers a hierarchical view of a project and is used to divide it into more manageable, smaller jobs. It also acts as the main source for planning the activities' schedules and calculating the development costs and time of the project, ensuring that each work is identified and completed efficiently. A work breakdown structure has been built for this project, as shown below, which essentially provides an overview of the entire process that occurs throughout each particular task that is assigned to us.

3.2 Process/Activity wise Time Distribution

The amount of time needed to complete each task during software development is referred to as the "process wise time distribution." Figure 1 illustrates how our approach is primarily focused on 4 activities: requirement analysis, development, testing, and deployment. Figure 2 illustrates the time distribution for each activity using the critical path method, which allows project managers to concentrate on the most important tasks and allocate resources accordingly to complete their objectives within the designated time.

3.3 Gantt Chart

Gantt Chart is a project management tool that enables management to see the project's schedule and monitor its progress over time. Each length of the bar in this illustration denotes the time required to finish a certain task. Figure 3 shows the duration of the internship program at ADN Diginet Limited. Each and every duty that has been assigned follows the aforementioned activities, which are repeated two weeks following each sprint.

3.4 Process/Activity wise Resource Allocation

Process wise resource allocation is a tool which records the allocation of resources to each project development activity as well as the amount of time needed to finish each activity. Figure 5 displays the time needed for each activity throughout the course of a 23-day period length of each sprint as well as the proportion of overall work that each activity requires 23 days. It has been observed that the development requires the highest percentage of resources while the deployment takes the lowest.

Chapter 4

Methodology

Agile Methodology is followed at ADN Diginet Limited. Agile methodology is a flexible and client-oriented approach of managing projects and creating software that focuses on teamwork, adaptation, and distributing work in small fragments. At first, the team does some background research on the project that they would be doing by going through multiple similar projects. The team has weekly sprint meetings to finalize the requirements. After discussing with the project leader, the requirement is documented and on confirmation, the team shows each of their work on the meetings that take place once in every two weeks. The work then shifts to the development phase, with the main goals being the completion of the allocated tasks as well as a fully functional system free of any issues before the following sprint meeting. The code is then tested by the leader to ensure that it is bug free and to provide insights on the quality of the code. Changes are made as per the insights and shown in the next meeting.

Chapter 5

Body of the Project

5.1 Work Description

As a data analyst intern at ADN Diginet Limited, I had the opportunity to take part in projects related to data analytics as well as projects consisting of full stack development.

Ultrashop is a project that can be customized as per the client's requirement. I have worked with the customer module team as well as the general module team to work on various features of the website. I have worked on resetting passwords by getting links on email, product page, customer wishlist, account management, and Itering.I worked on the front-end as well as the back-end for these features. Additionally, I have worked on various projects that required web scraping. I have also worked on data analytics projects such as HRM dashboard, Finance Dashboard, etc. which were implemented using Microsoft powerBI after data cleaning.

5.2 System Analysis

5.2.1 Six Element Analysis

5.2.2 Feasibility Analysis

- ^ Technical feasibility :The technology required for the project has to be analyzed to know if it is available or can be implemented. Moreover, the expertise of the technical team assigned to the project has to be analyzed as well so that they can implement the features assigned to them successfully. The technology should be able to handle multiple user requests simultaneously and hence, it should be scalable. It has to be examined if the technology can ensure security measures.
- ^ Economic Feasibility :A cost-benefit analysis is done to ensure that the profit exceeds the expenses. Moreover, the sources of funding for the project should be identified as well to meet its budget allocation. All the expenses related to the project should be considered.
- ^ Operational Feasibility :The market trends should be analyzed to understand if the product is in demand. A unique market strategy has to be developed to attract customers. There also has to be a good customer retention strategy so that the customers can be retained.

5.2.3 Problem Solution Analysis

To conduct problem solution analysis, at first the existing problems were identified. One of the problems was resetting passwords. While most e-commerce websites provide resetting passwords on their webpage, we have implemented an email system for this. Everytime, an user wants to reset their password, they would be automatically sent an email with the reset password link which they can follow to reset their password. This is safer as well for the users. Some websites do not allow customers to add a wishlist, hence the wishlist was also implemented. Another problem was customers having only one billing address, so the website allows up to two billing addresses. Moreover, as this project can be customized as per clients specifications, more features can be easily added.

5.2.4 Effect and Constraints Analysis

This analysis is done to identify the effects and potential of the project as well as the constraints. This helps in achieving the goals of the project with the available resources.

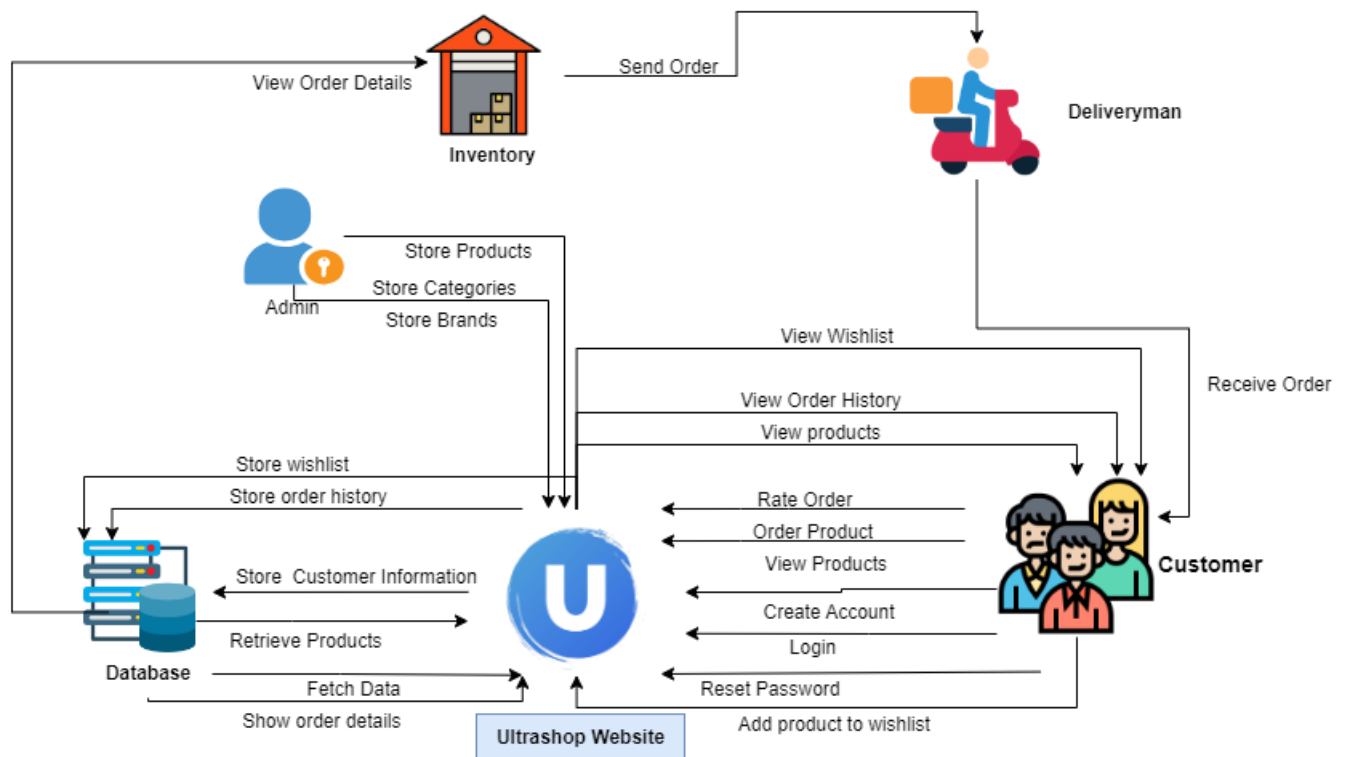


Figure 5.3: Rich picture

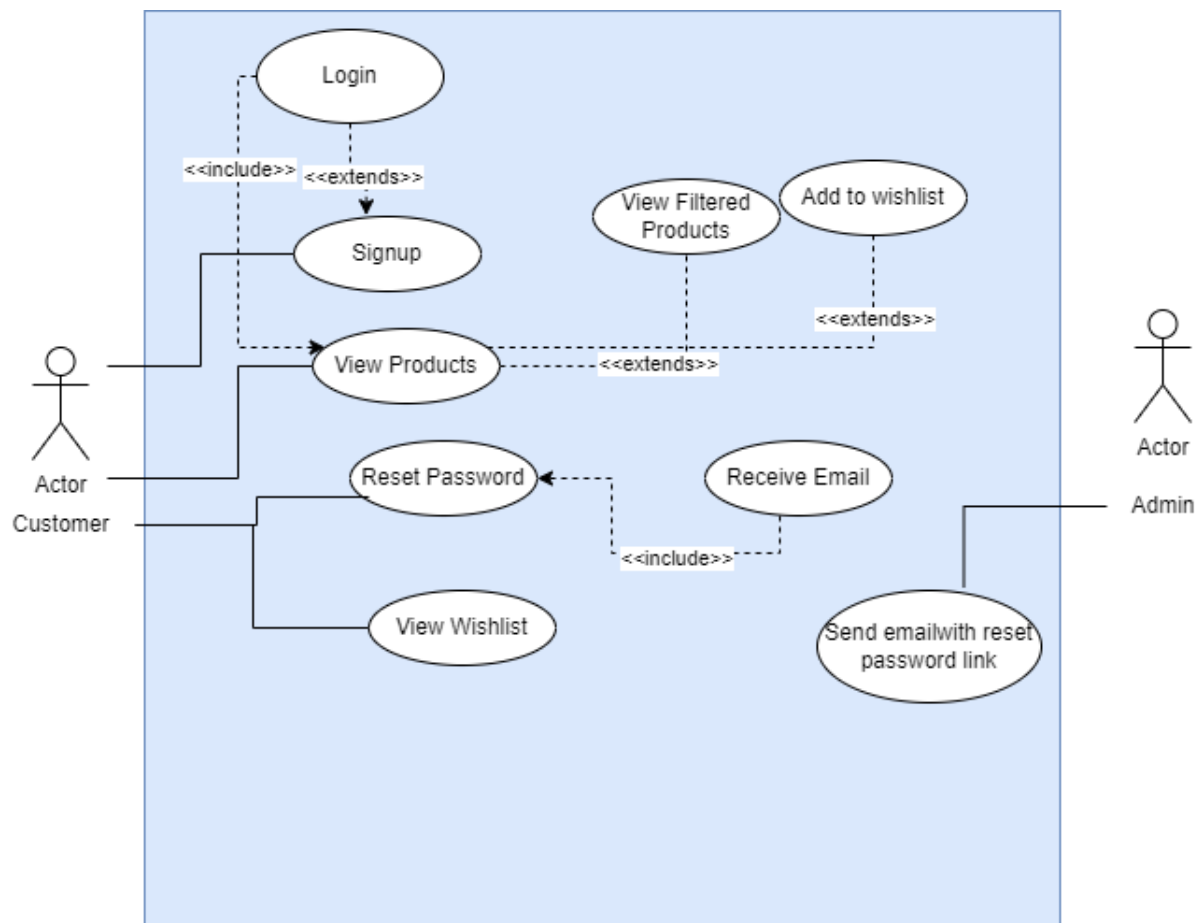


Figure 5.4: Use Case for Ultrashop

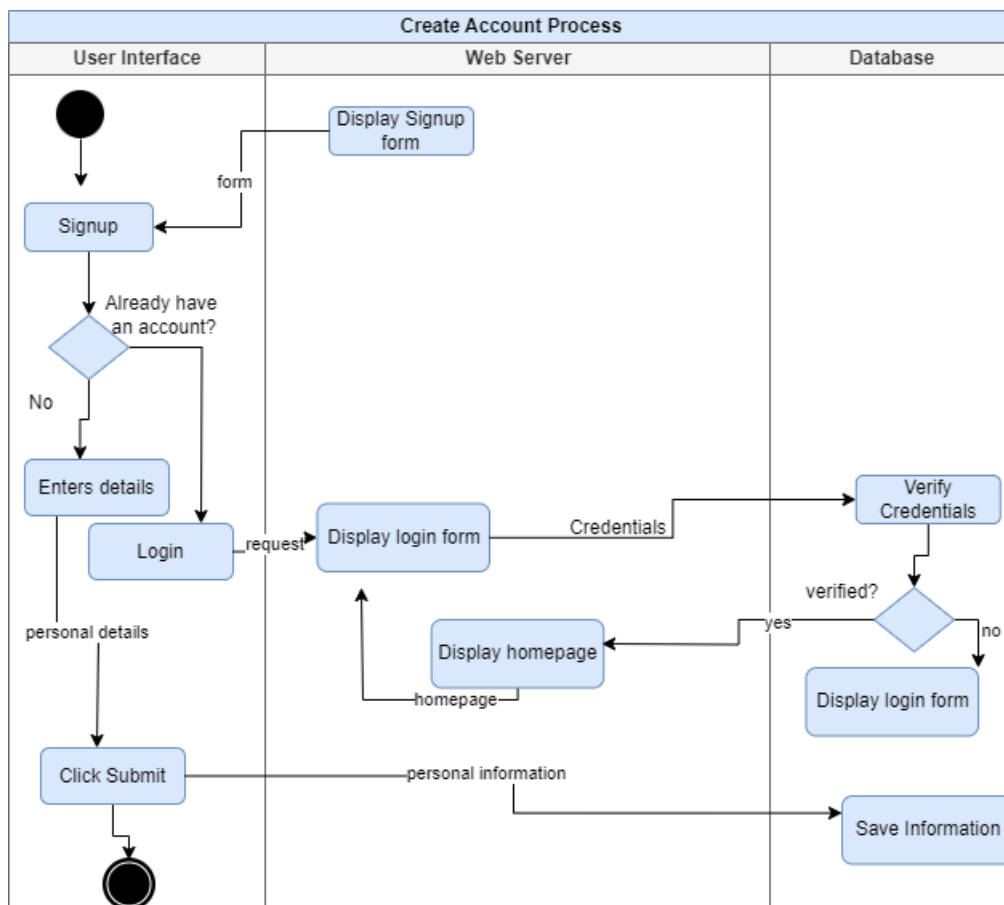


Figure 5.5: Signup Process

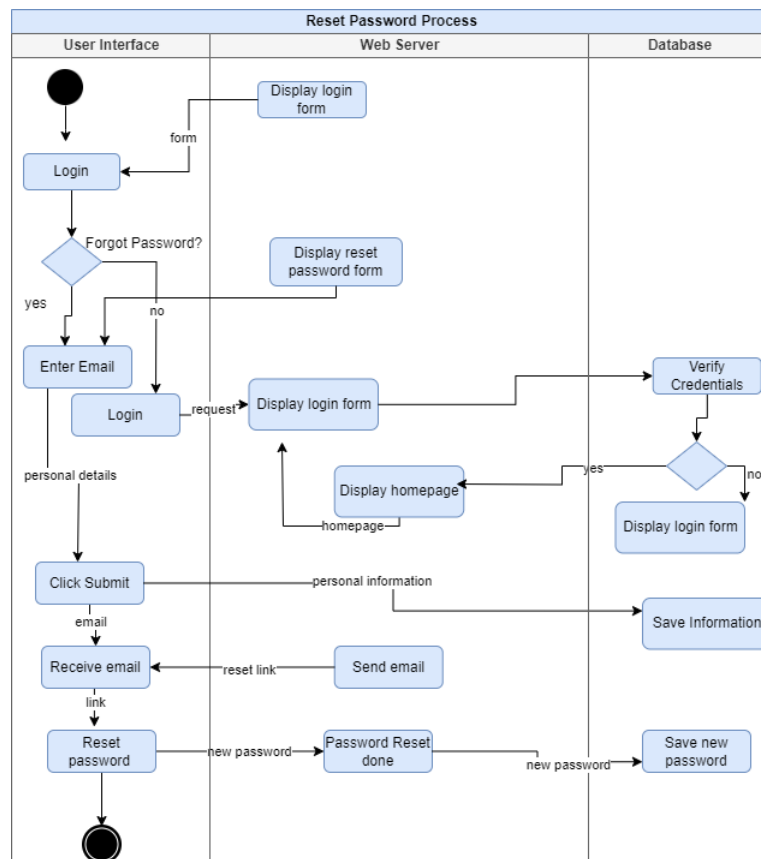


Figure 5.6: Reset Password Process

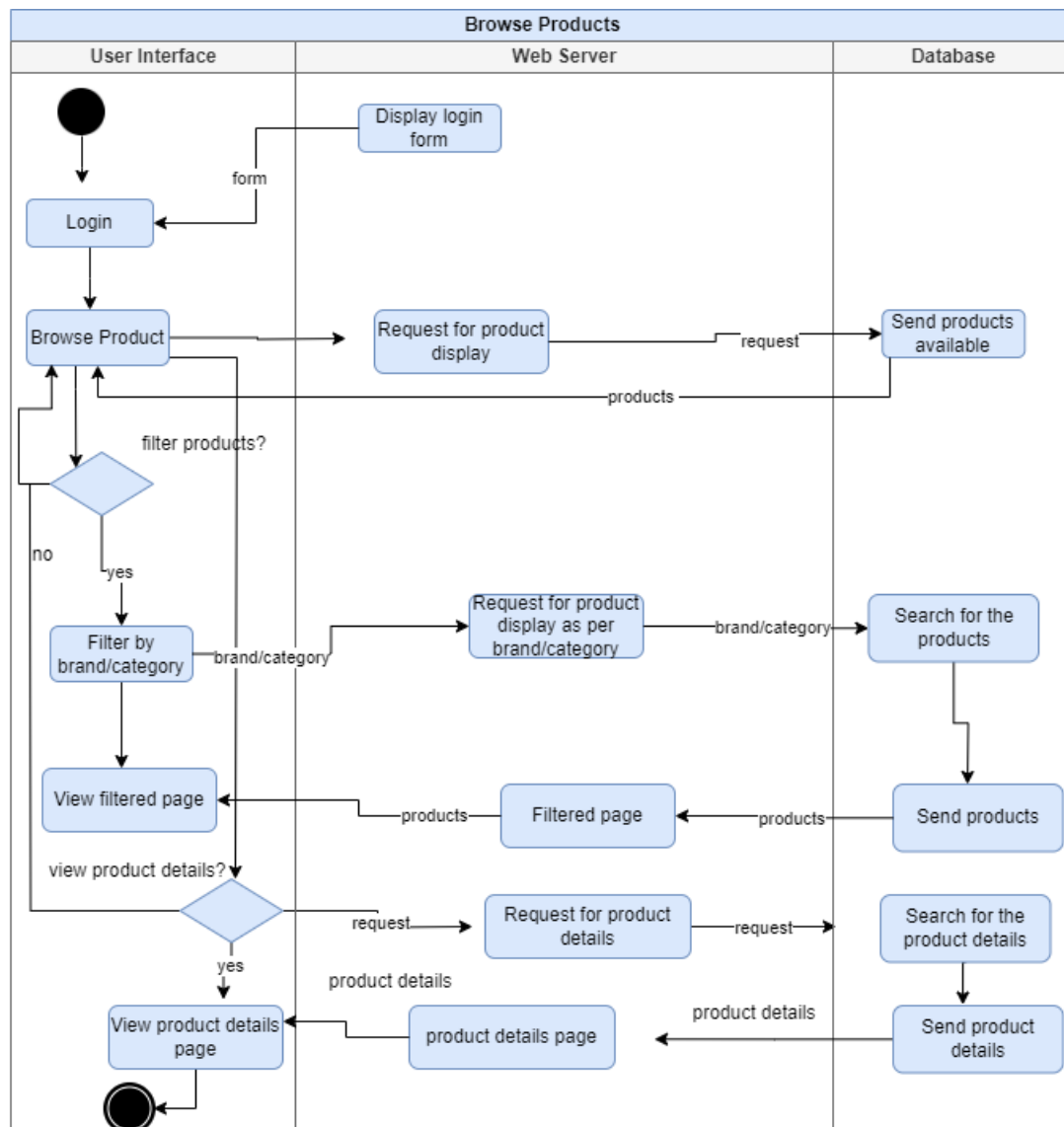


Figure 5.7: Browse Products Process

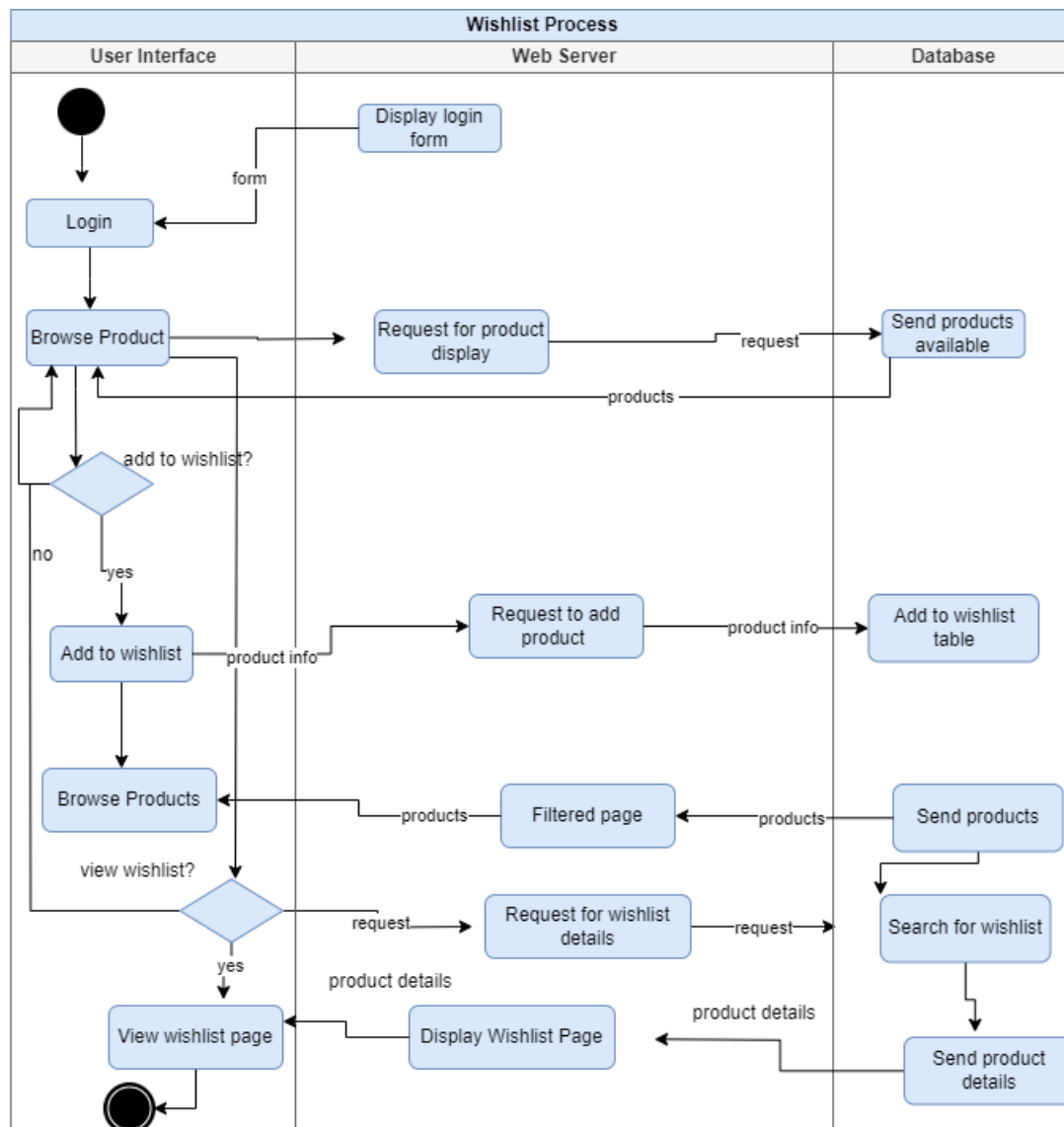


Figure 5.8: Wishlist Process

5.3.3 Functional Requirements

- ^ Website visitors should be able to create new accounts.

5.3.4 Non-Functional Requirements

- ^ Performance : The website should be able to handle user requests and process them rapidly as the user needs to have a smooth browsing experience. It needs to be able to handle multiple user requests simultaneously.
- ^ Security : User information must be secure as it contains sensitive information. Hence, strong security measures must be placed to avoid security breaches on the website.
- ^ Availability : The website should be available 24/7. Hence, the downtime for any updates and maintenance should be as minimal as possible.
- ^ Usability : The website should be easy to navigate since positive user experience is important. It should be responsive as well. Scalability: The website should be scalable regardless of the amount of users it has.
- ^ Reliability : The website should be reliable so that customers can process payments securely. Moreover, it also has an impact on the reputation of the company.

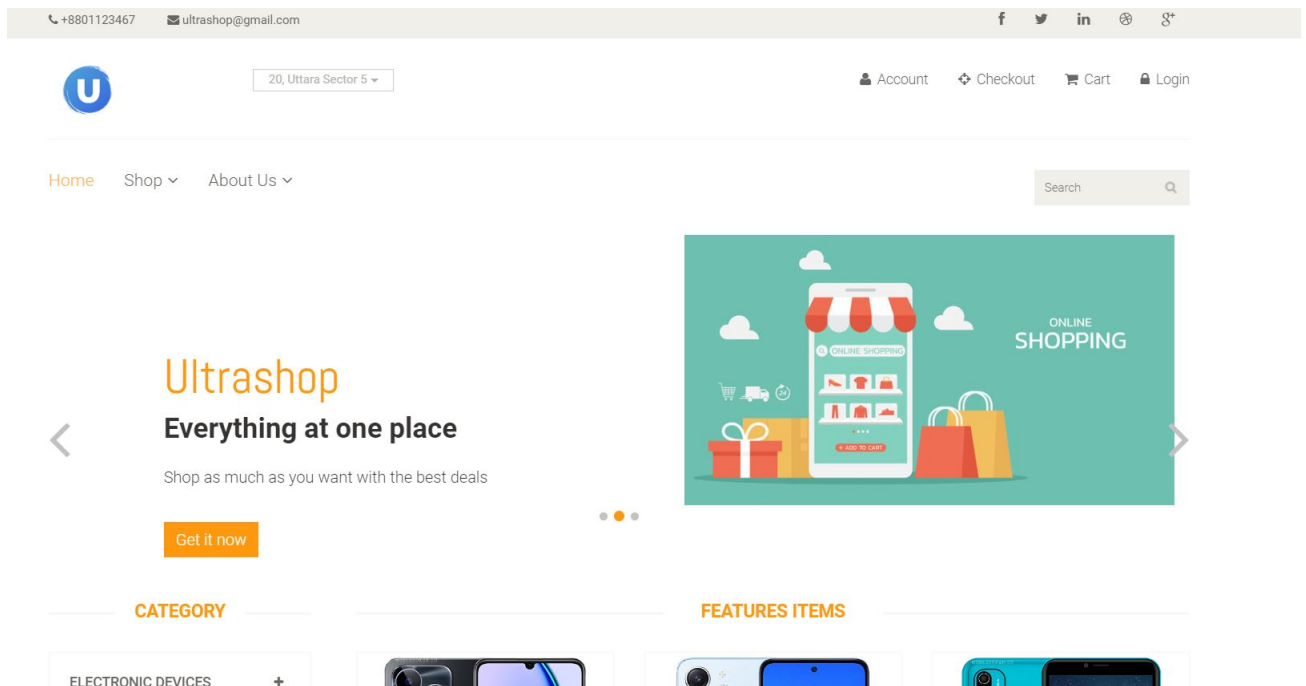


Figure 5.9: Homepage

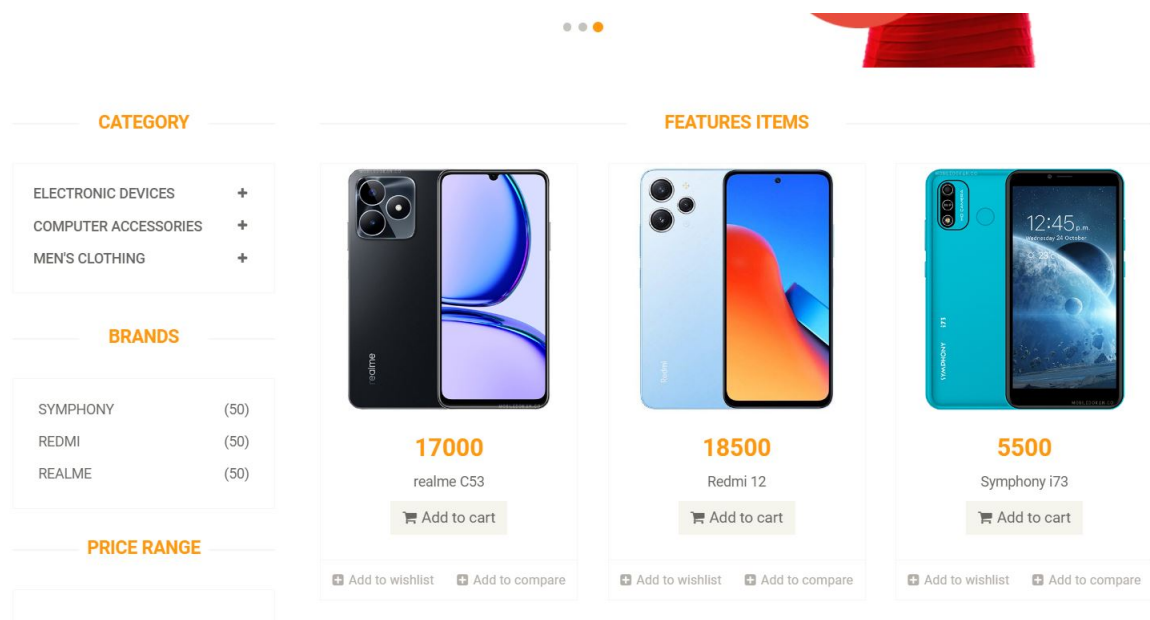


Figure 5.10: Homepage

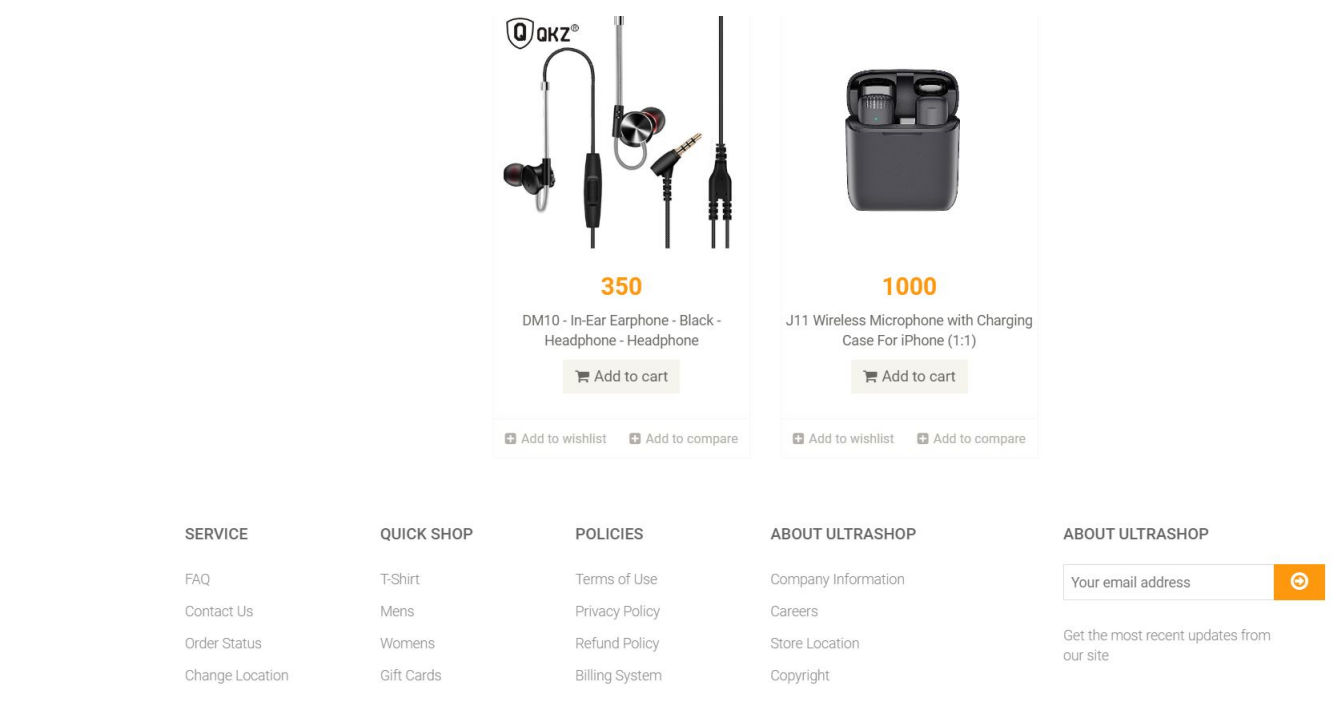


Figure 5.11: Homepage

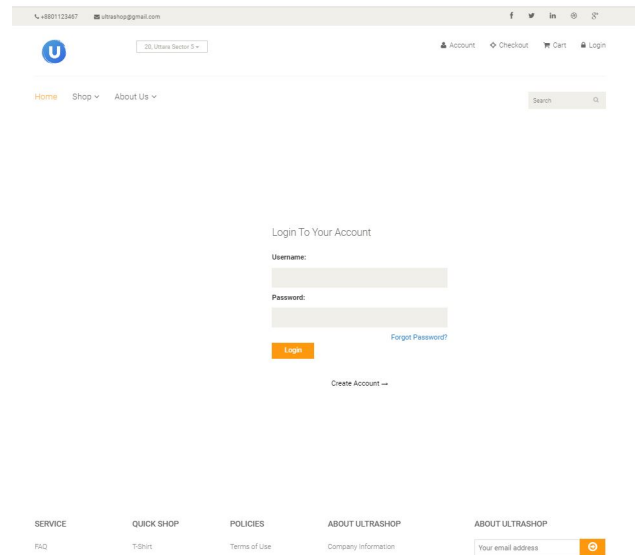

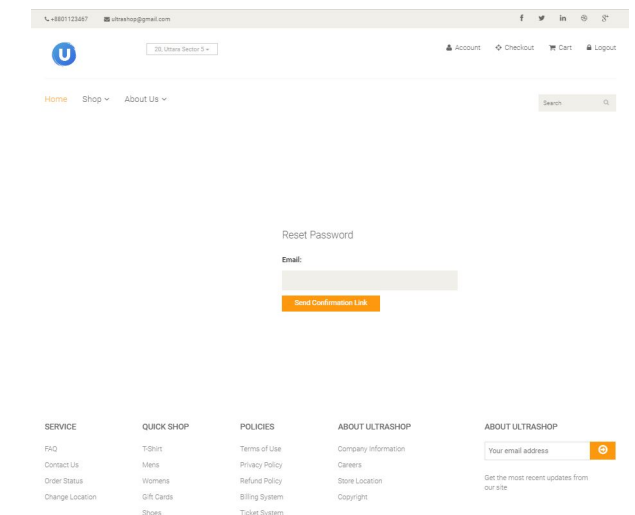

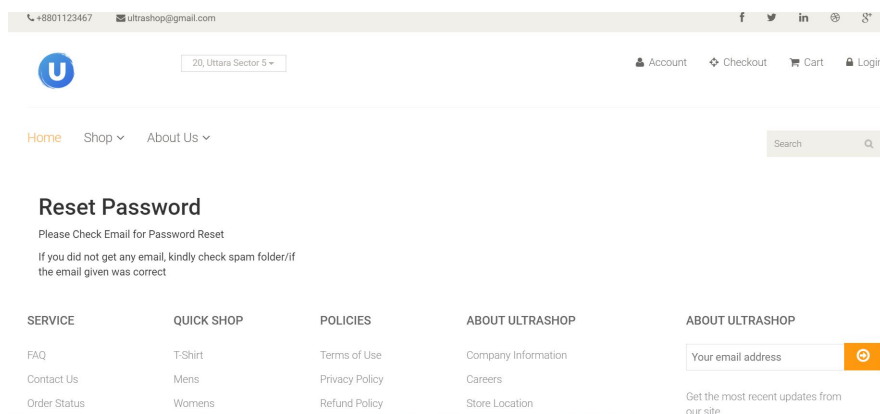

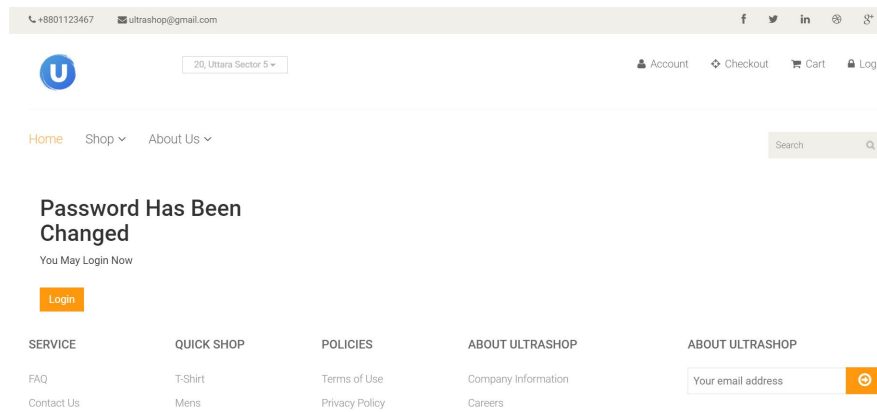


Figure 5.16: Password Reset Done

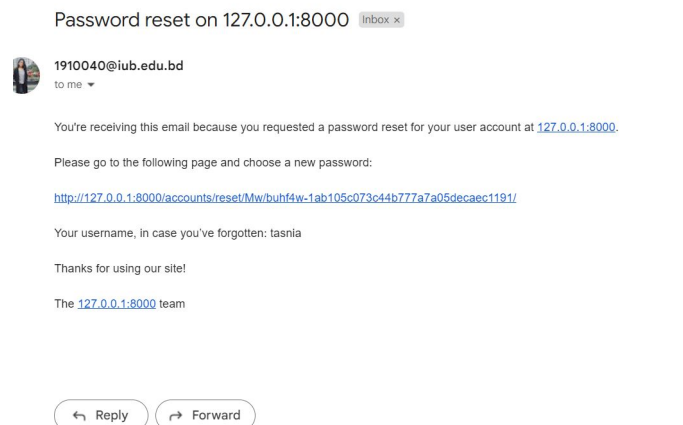


Figure 5.17: Password Reset Email

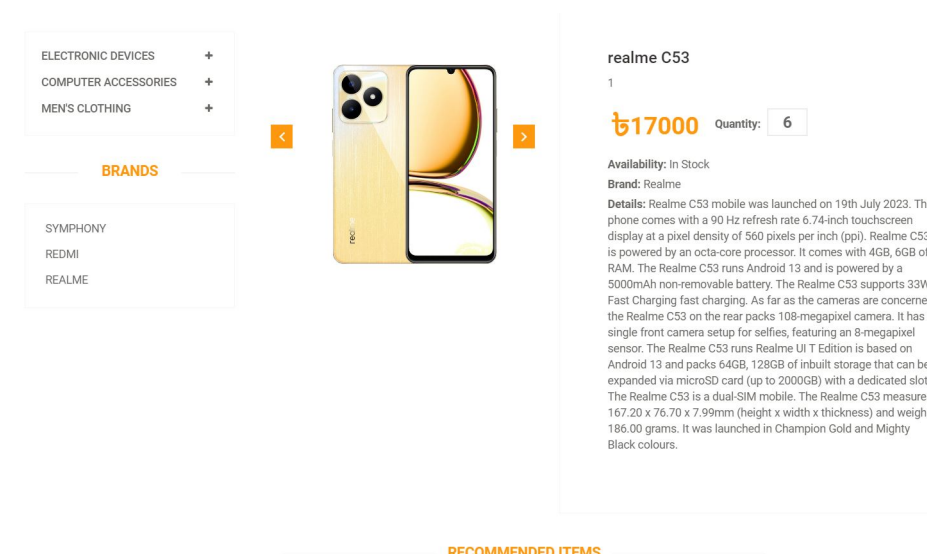


Figure 5.18: Product Details Page

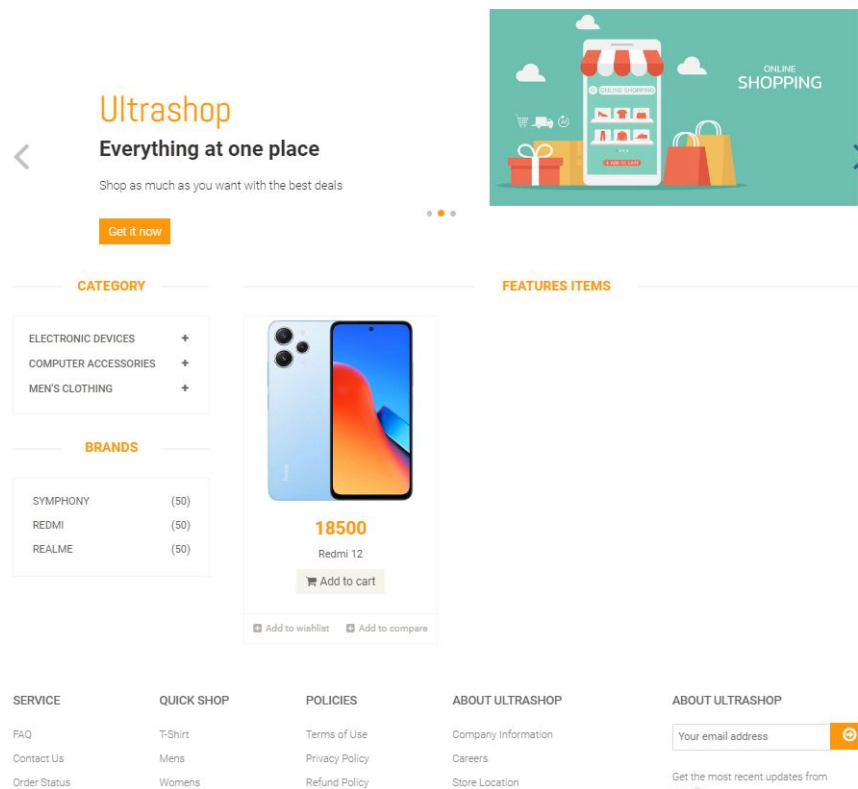


Figure 5.19: Filter Products by Brand

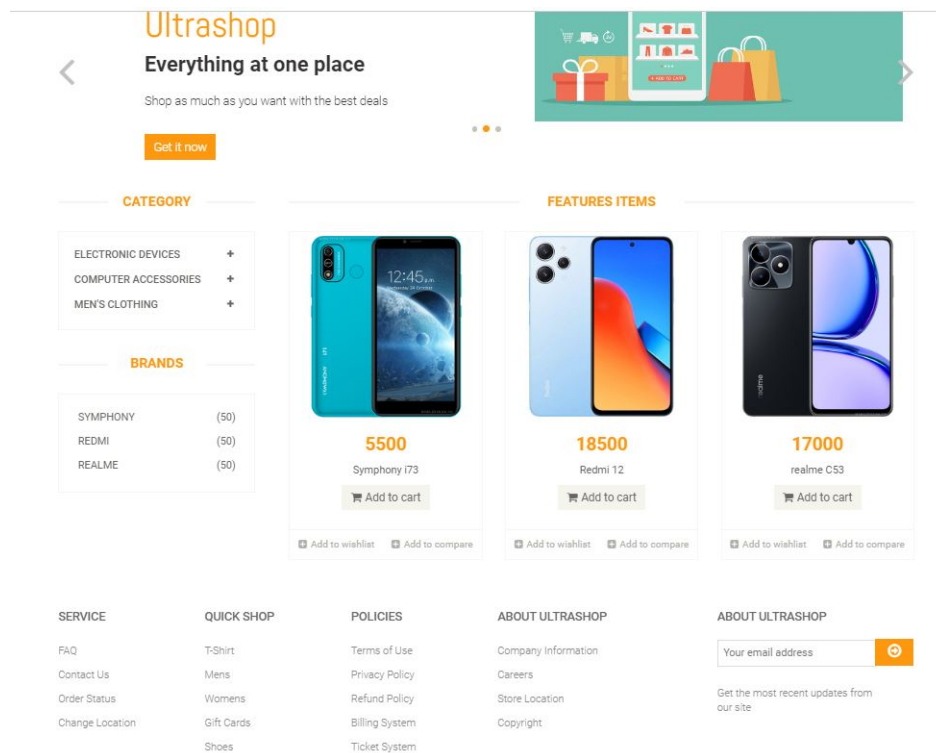


Figure 5.20: Filter Products by Category

Chapter 7

Project as Engineering Problem Analysis

7.1 Sustainability of the Project/Work

A sustainable project is that which is working efficiently and meeting the requirements.

- ^ Security of Data

It is important to ensure the security of the information provided by the user. Passwords need to be encrypted, payments need to be secure as well. In conclusion, strong security measures should be implemented to maintain the privacy of the users.

- ^ Code Quality

The technical team considers enhancing the quality of code so that it is readable to any newcomers. Moreover, if the quality of code is maintained, it also helps in identifying errors faster.

- ^ Documentation

To make sure that the project is understandable to any team which might be working on it, documentation is important. It helps the developers to understand the phases of the project and helps in enhancing the quality of work.

- ^ Usability

The company has various features in mind to make the user experience better. Virtual trial systems are to be introduced in future so that customers do not have to worry about what would suit them anymore. They can just upload a picture and it would give them an image of them wearing the product. This would be implemented by the ML team. Moreover, live streams would be introduced so that companies can broadcast their products on the website directly. The company also plans to have an option for Bangla language to make it easier for users who are fluent in Bangla.

- ^ Evaluation

Each of the features of the project is to be tested so that there are no bugs. It is important

to evaluate the code thoroughly before deploying the project so that the errors can be dealt with earlier. Also, it would not hamper user experience as well.

^ Accessibility

The project would have more than one currency options for payment in future so that international customers can also use the website. The company also plans to implement sentiment analysis to propose business solutions for the client. It would help them understand when and why a product might not be desirable anymore and also help to acquire and retain customers.

7.2 Social and Environmental Effects and Analysis

^ Time Saving

Since customers can do online transactions, it would save their time as they do not have to visit the physical store. It would consume a significant amount of time to browse through products, and brands that the customers desire but now they can just do it online which again saves time.

^ Cost Saving

The website would offer various discounts throughout the year which would eventually reduce the expense of the customers. Moreover, since they do not have to commute to the physical stores anymore, it also saves money. As for the company, once the new features are implemented, they can take a glance at the report from sentiment analysis and make better decisions. They also do not have to hire additional salesmen as the customers would make online purchases a lot.

^ Accessibility

Since the website is accessible to anyone, now customers with mobility challenges or those who live in distant places have access to the services.

^ Job Opportunities

Since e-commerce websites need to manage customers 24/7 it opens the possibility of hiring more customer care executives, delivery men, etc. Hence, there would be many job opportunities available.

^ Greenhouse Emissions

Since customers can virtually buy products from the website and do not need to travel to the store, it reduces the greenhouse emissions from vehicles.

7.3 Addressing Ethics and Ethical Issues

^ Privacy and Security of Data

The e-commerce website handles user transactions every day which leads to the concern of maintaining the privacy of customers as it contains sensitive information and online transactions need to be secure. Protecting the information of the customers is one of the most important responsibilities of an e-commerce business. Effective security measures has to be implemented to maintain the privacy and security of customers.

^ Authenticity of Information

It is important to provide accurate information on the website about the products and services.

^ Integrity of Website

The website should be able to identify fake customer information to ensure the integrity of the website.

^ Pricing

Products should be priced fairly to retain customers. It is unethical to price the products unfairly. Moreover, the same price should be shown to all customers.

^ Using Customer Data

Ensuring to use customer data fairly is important. Consent should be taken as well for the sentiment analysis if it is introduced. Protecting customer data should be one of the main priorities.

^ Interactive User Interface

User interface should not consider complicated designs which might mislead the users. It should be as user friendly as possible. The content should be easily understandable as well.

Chapter 8

Lesson Learned

8.1 Problems Faced During this Period

- ^ Limitations in Knowledge

Before joining ADN Diginet Limited as an intern, I had a basic idea about data science and data analytics. I had never used tools like powerBI or libraries such as BeautifulSoup. During the internship period, I was taught the fundamentals of data science and learned the vastness of the field. I also had to use github a lot for every task which required me to have a proper understanding of the git commands.

- ^ Lack of Experience

I had no experience in data analytics which made it difficult to understand the requirements of the projects related to data analytics. Also, since I had never used Microsoft powerBI, it was hard to get the concept initially and understand how DAX(Data Analytics Expressions) worked. Web Scraping was also a challenge as it involves inspecting the websites thoroughly.

- ^ Handling multiple projects

As I was a data analyst intern but I had also been in the backend team for this project, at times, it was hard to complete all the tasks assigned to me. Throughout the internship period, I was involved in various projects, in various roles. In some projects, I was taking requirements from clients, in other projects, I was assigned to lead a team to design a prototype for a client and also prepare powerpoint slides and document the requirements, etc. Since it was my first time working in the industry, at times it was overwhelming to be involved in so many projects at once.

8.2 Solution of those Problems

- ^ To understand the fundamentals of data science, it was important to self study a lot. So I started researching more about the topic and learned about various tools and techniques used in data science. I communicated with my trainer often whenever I had any queries or to show my task and get his feedback. I read some documentation, and watched videos from Youtube to learn more about Microsoft powerBI and its uses and benefits. For backend development, I read django documentation thoroughly to understand the framework better. This helped me in completing all the assigned tasks to me in due time. My trainer also helped me by showing a live demonstration of Git commands and also powerBI.
- ^ I was assigned multiple tasks related to data analytics which helped me grasp the concept better and although I was not experienced at that time, it took me little time to do the tasks efficiently. My coworkers also helped me in solving the problems faced during the tasks.
- ^ To make sure that I was meeting the deadlines for each project, I made a planner where I planned how long I should work on a specific task and also I prioritized the most important projects first. This helped me in completing the tasks I was assigned to within due time. I also communicated with my trainer to know which projects were the most important and needed to be completed sooner. Additionally, everytime I documented the requirements, I sent it to my trainer for approval and made any changes required as per his feedback.

Chapter 9

Future Work & Conclusion

9.1 Future Works

The current website is purposely made to be generic so that the same kind of projects do not have to be coded from scratch. As per the client's requirements, more features could be added or some current feature could be removed. However, the company does have some plans for this project. They want to introduce a virtual trial system for clothings so that customers can now see if they really like the product they want to buy and not be disappointed later on. It is also planned to make this website also suggest business solutions based on the sentiment analysis done by learning the customer interactions. A live streaming option would be available which can be used to directly broadcast live from the website. Recommendations based on the past purchases of the customers are to be introduced as well. All these would be implemented by the machine learning team. The company also plans to have a wholesale rate system for customers who would be buying products at bulk.

9.2 Conclusion

In conclusion, my time as an intern has been an excellent opportunity to learn and will benefit my career tremendously. I had the opportunity to map my academic knowledge into industry projects and this has helped me in enhancing my technical skills. By being involved in various projects, I have improved my technical skills as well as my soft skills.

The internship has provided me with the opportunity to work with highly experienced professionals and to gain the knowledge that they have provided. Most of the projects required me to work in a team which impacted greatly to improve my communication skills. Since opportunities in the data science field are increasing nowadays, I believe that this learning experience will help me immensely in future. This could help me in future collaborations.

Overall, I would like to say that I had an incredible experience by joining this internship program. It has been a pathway for me to take the first steps toward my professional career. I am eager to use the knowledge and experience I have acquired during my time as an intern in my future endeavors.
